After Zoe Dunne completed this year at Malibu High School she said a special goodbye to her friends there and had started to meet new friends from around the world. She spoke at the Maibu Rotary Club meeting on July 27th. In 3 days she would be headed for a new high school in Rüsselsheim Germany as part of the Rotary Youth Exchange



program. She is being sponsored by the Rotary Club of Malibu, and is one of three high school students in the Los Angeles Rotary District 5280 to be selected this year to study next year in a foreign country. As the incoming part of the Rotary Youth Exchange 3 students from foreign countries will be coming to high schools in the Los Angeles area.

Zoe came to the Malibu Rotary Club meeting with Rotary District 5280 Youth Exchange Co-chair **Warren Bobrow** of the Westchester Rotary Club.

Zoe said she always liked to travel, and wanted to be a foreign exchange student. Her family investigated different programs and concluded the Rotary Youth Exchange program was the best one. Her sister became a foreign exchange student to Sweden. The Rotary Youth Exchange program was first established in 1923 to help foster world peace and understanding. Students between the ages of 15 ½ and 18 ½ go to high school in a foreign country and stay with host families who are members of Rotary Clubs in the host countries. Typically, although they go to the same school for the year, they stay with 2 or 3 host families. The students themselves do not have to be relatives of Rotarians, nor is there any GPA or academic requirement.

Students write essays about themselves, where they would like to go and why. They may or may not be given their first choice of a country. Although they may be given language classes, they may have to learn the new language on the fly. Zoe admits she speaks very little German, but hopes to quickly learn. She said she was able to meet her primary host family in Rüsselsheim. The family consists of a mother, father and son. The son is going to be a Rotary Youth Exchange student in New Mexico. Another family she will stay with has two daughters.

Several Rotary Districts in California, Arizona, Nevada, Utah and Hawaii have joined their Youth Exchange programs together to get even more students together and share their experiences. This multidistrict youth exchange program, using the acronym SCANEX, has incoming and outgoing students meet several times a year. Zoe was able to meet some of these students before her departure.

Rotary YES/SCANEX USA Train Tour was founded by Paul R. St. John, a past President of the Malibu Rotary Club, as a way for those Rotary Youth Exchange Students who completed their high school year in the USA successfully to see more than just the area around their host club. 45 Youth Exchange students participated in the Train Tour this year.

The tour is based on a 30-day rail pass for foreign passport holders and makes approximately 15 stops, seeing major cities of the US, including San Francisco, the Rotary International Headquarters in Chicago, New York, Washington DC, continues down the Atlantic coat to Florida before returning to Los Angles. Overnight homestays with Rotary families are planned to cover four distinctly different regions of the USA. Hotels, youth hostels and public transportation is used whenever possible. The tour is paid for by the students.

Paul and his wife Melody, who is past president of the Hollywood Rotary Club, have no children of their own, but have hosted a foreign student each year for at least the past dozen years. They stay in touch with all their adopted children and many have been invited back to act as chaperones on the Train Tour. Paul and Melody are hosting one of the three incoming Youth Exchange students again this year.

Warren said there are many more students that want to come here than there are host families and he is always looking for qualified local host families who want to have the foreign teen stay in their home and be part of the family.

Other News and Guests from Last Malibu Rotary Club Meeting
