# Qadir Mohiuddin Ph.D,

# Talks about his Personal Observations of GeoPolitics and Economics



Qadir Mohiuddin Ph.D, is Associate Professor of Economics, New York Institute of Technology at Nanjing, Jiangusu, China. Fortunately for the members of the Rotary Club of Malibu, he is also the husband of one Malibu Rotary Club's newest members, Beth Mohiuddin. We say fortunate, because if it were not for Beth, we probably would not have been able to get such an international expert on geopolitics and the economy and historical events that are shaping today's world news.

What Dr Mohiuddin told us is not something that you would hear in his economics class in China. It was a thoughtful assessment of areas of the world that are always in the news. Pakistan and Afghanistan was a place that few Americans were aware of before 9/11. After that we only knew what we read in the newspaper. For Qadir, Pakistan is was where he began his life and he has been studying the geopolitics and economy of the area for many years. He father was the first Pakistani pilot in the British Air Force and became the main Air Traffic Controller in Pakistan.

Qadir's formal education includes a B.A. from UCLA in 1977 – in Political Science-international relations and Economics. While at UCLA he was Elected Coordinator, Head of Foreign Students Association at UCLA. He then received a Masters Degree in Planning at USC 1979 – Regional Planning and (country) Development. He interned at the City of Los Angeles, but also studied in France and traveled Western Europe and around the world. He then received a second Masters Degree, a MSSM, at USC in 1983 – Management and MIS. At that time he Authored/consulted possible Soviet plans to reach the warm waters of the Indian Ocean – A Dream going as far back as the Russian Czars. He then received a PhD at the University of Pennsylvania in 1991. Thesis/Dissertation Title: .Multinational Enterprise Direct International Business Investment...' (US-MNE-DFI: A Theoretical and Empirical Study of National-Policies Trade & Monetary, Location-Industrial, Financial Market-Arbitrage & Strategic Planning-Management Considerations in 12 Industrial Countries), ), using then advanced econometric techniques to study U.S. Multinational corporations' investment in Western Europe: Holland, Belgium, UK, Sweden, Norway, France, Italy, 'West' Germany, Ireland, Japan, Canada, Australia.

Qadir authored a report in 1979, later copyrighted (Library of Congress), for the development of an industrial export zone in Pakistan, along with military bases to prevent a Soviet invasion of Pakistan. This effort culminated with an offer of funding for further study through an alumnus of the University of Pennsylvania at the CSIS-Center for Strategic and International Studies, Washington, D.C

In arriving at today's topic on the relationship between GeoPolitics and Economics Dr Mohiuddin drew on studies and collaborations he has had with various people and organizations. He defines several terms for us:

**GeoPolitics** is international relations influenced by geography, and **GeoStrategy** is **Geopolitics** influenced by **Strategy** (1979-1981).

Soviet Invasion of Afghanistan – Its impact on Pakistan & the USA



In the 1970's the USSR bordered Afghanistan and Pakistan, and represented the only land that kept Russia from having a warm water in Gulf of Oman, near the Persian Gulf. They really wanted the Karachi, Pakistan port. The fact is the Russian Czars were considering invading Pakistan in the early twentieth century. The **Soviet war in Afghanistan** lasted nine years from December 1979 to February 1989. It was fought between Soviet-led Afghan forces against multi-national insurgent groups called the Mujahideen. The Mujahideen were the local Muslim warlords who ended up controlling the country after the war. Mujahideen has been most closely associated by the west with radical Islam, encompassing several militant groups and struggles. After 9/11 they were among the people the US was fighting in Afghanistan, but in 1979, because they were fighting Soviet Russia, the US supported them.

Although Dr Mohiuddin didn't talk about this (it is documented in Wikipedia and cited be Editor John) it was through an increasing project of military assistance via the US CIA and partly funded by Saudi Arabia, the USA started to supply the Mujahideen with its man-portable anti-aircraft missile system called the Stinger. The US supplied at least 250 launcher systems and at least 500 individual Stinger missiles to the Mujahideen as well as the training needed to operate the system. US Congressman Charlie Wilson who was instrumental in funding the Stingers for the Mujahideen said that before the Stinger the Mujahideen never won a set piece battle with the Soviets but after it was introduced, the Mujahideen never again lost one.

# The Relationship between the Economy and GeoPolitical and GeoStrategic Strength

In 1989 Dr Mohiuddin co-authored as Co-Consultant to the US Business RoundTable (a formal group of nationwide American CEO's, and at that time chaired by the CEO of General Mills) a confidential report with Nobel Laureate in Economics (and past economics advisor to the President of the United States), and two Professors in Finance one in Wharton finance, (one later became the Governor of the Turkey's Central Bank). The report, requested by a US Congressman, researched and analyzed US economic, business, and financial conditions until 1989. The study further evaluated any consequent impact of the increasing US debt burden in 1989 on the US economy. Among other topics, examined the impact of junk bonds, private corporation issues, and carried out forecasting.

In 1989, President of the US was George Bush, Senior. The buildup of US debt was during President Ronald Reagan, who was President 1982-1989. The USSR fell in 1991. During Jimmy Carter 1977-1981, inflation rates and interest rates were high. Mortgage rates were double digits. The Economy was strong in 1988 and 1989, but the concern was how the US debt and Household debt, combined with High inflation, and High interest rates would undermine the economy in 1989 and beyond. We survived the high debt levels, because the conclusion of US Business RoundTable authors (including Dr Mohiuddin) was that the US economy was resilient.

#### What does this mean to us in 2014?

Does a weak economy lead to a weak Defense? Probably not.

But it could weaken Global Reach and GeoPolitical Strength. There was a concern in 1989 that with our huge debt we could not afford the Defense budget. The debt is even greater now. The US Gross Domestic Production (GDP) is \$16 trillion and the debt is also \$16 trillion.

CONTRASTING THE ECONOMY - 1989 AND NOW

Stock market crash of 1987 was due to a computer glitch-- automatic computer trading caused a sell-off. It was not the high levels of Household or Federal debt.

Dr Mohiuddin says that each of us knows what happened in the most recent recession, so he did not discuss the causes, except to NOTE that the causes were again related to extremely high Household and Federal debt.

A worry that the government has is that we won't have enough money to pay for our military. Dr Mohiuddin cited examples of how the U.S. compares to other major powers in that regard. In article by Zachary Keck in the April 2014 *The Diplomat* online the author notes Russia spends more of its wealth on arms than US. In 2013 Russian defence spending rises by 4.8% to \$88bn, devoting larger share of GDP on military than US for first time since 2003. Russia's defense spending will increase by 18% in 2014, and another 33% over the next two years.

## Are we Ok in our military spending?

**Dr Mohiuddin:** I would say YES, But the Cost of the military and defense is Cheaper in China and Russia. However, should we increase military spending to project US strategic interests?

Dr M. then showed us a graph which illustrated that the US spends more on defense than the next 8 countries combined.

# Are we Ok Geo-Strategically?

**Dr Mohiuddin:** I would say YES.

- But the Cost of the military and defense is Cheaper in China and Russia
- However, should we increase military spending to project US strategic interests? The Answer is YES.
- Why? Others and Russia are taking the initiative to redesign the world, and this could lead to chaos, as the US sees it, and become more costly for the US to project geostrategic power in the future.

Dr Hohiuddin says that Putin has ambitious designs on the world. Putin, whose father was a cook in the Czar's kitchen, needs to know that the US is serious about protecting its world interests.

When asked about the threat from the Islamic terrorist organizations versus the threat from Russia or China, Dr Huhiuddin says he worries about the super powers more, because they have nuclear weapons, and their nuclear weapons could end up in the hands of the terrorists, so we have to keep both Russia and China in check.
