Malibu Rotary Club Gets Surprise Visit by Still Recovering Club President



Since Malibu Rotary Club President Bill Wishard had open heart surgery on April 9 he was too weak to attend any Rotary meetings or events. Last year he made reservations to go to the Rotary International Convention held the end of this month in Lisbon. He had wanted to go to Malibu Rotary Club's biggest event which was held on May 29th—the successful Maggie Luckerath produced Brazilian Bash Blowout event at the hilltop mansion resort owned by an NBA star, the property managed by Malibu Rotarian Donna Bohana. He sent in his check and was trying his hardest to go, even if his daughter and others were discouraging him from doing so. But other powers prevailed.

Until last week Bill had been in a rehab facility in Carlsbad, California, where the administrators would not let him leave for more than four hours. If he was gone longer than four hours he would be locked out and not allowed to return---and he really needed the facility for continued rehab at that point. As a result he was unable to go to the May 29th Malibu Rotary Club event. And he realizes also that he will not be strong enough in time to get to the Rotary International Convention in Lisbon.

On the other hand he knows he is working hard and his strength is improving. By the end of last week, with continued physical therapy, as he had gone from wheelchair to walker to cane, he has been transferred from the live-in rehab center to his daughter's house in Carlsbad. Physical therapists are making house calls at his daughter's house, which costs less for Medicare than paying for the Carlsbad live-in facility. It also means Bill does not have to abide by the strict regimen of the facility he had been lilving in.

With Bill's liberation from the rehab center he started thinking about how could again get back into the Rotary flow, actually go to his Rotary Club meeting. He was thinking about this on Tuesday night. Bill's daughter Allison lives near an Amtrak station. Bill knew that he was forbidden by his doctor to drive. But he wasn't forbidden to take a train! On Tuesday night, before the Malibu Rotary Club noon meeting at Pepperdine, Bill conceived of a way that he could attend that meeting! He checked the train schedules. He saw that the Amtrak train that stops in Carlsbad, *The Pacific Surfliner*, comes through Los Angeles Union Station and goes as far as San Luis Obispo, with stops in Van Nuys, and Oxnard. His daughter or son-in-law could probably take him to the Carlsbad station in the morning. Could he be picked up at one of those Los Angeles stops and driven to the meeting in Malibu? He called his friend Malibu Rotarian Jimmy Mehmon Mon and asked him if he could pick up Bill at the Van Nuys Amtrak train station and drive him to the Malibu Rotary Club meeting at Pepperdine in Malibu. After the meeting Bill could return to Carlsbad the same way, catching the 4:13 p.m. train south in Van Nuys. Jimmy agreed, and so they both found their way to the Wednesday Malibu Rotary Club meeting at the Pepperdine Dresher Campus, even



though the room had been changed by Grazadio management minutes before the meeting, they were among the first to arrive.

Since neither Bill nor Jimmy nor Fred Cornet were able to get to the Malibu Rotary Brazilian Bash Blowout event the Malibu Rotary Club program of June 5th was changed to a command performance of pictures of the

event (available on the Malibu Rotary Club facebook) which were projected by John Elman on the large screen in the Malibu meeting room, while Maggie and John recapped the who's who of event participants and the beauty of the event venue. Fred, Jimmy and Bill could see what they missed.

Not surprisingly Maggie was given a standing ovation for her work on the May 29th event. Not only did she arrange the production of the event, from food to entertainment, she was responsible for getting most of the guests who attended. Despite the fact that the event was posted on the Rotary District Event calendar and the Rotary District newsletter, and \$400 was spent on a display ad in the Malibu Times, there was no one from our Rotary district there other than club members. People who attended the event did so largely because Maggie personally talked to them, and convinced them they should come, or send a check even if they couldn't make it.

As a result the event was profitable. Maggie didn't have exact numbers yet, but the net profit was probably in the vicinity of \$3,000.

Maggie reiterated what she had written last week:

"I thank especially Dr. W. David Baird for believing in me..... when all the others sat around at the meeting and looked very doubtful and only talked about how all the prior Malibu Rotary fund raisers in the past had been total flops or disasters and not at all successful - David is the one who said 'I believe in you Maggie and if you say so, I am sure you can pull it off'".

And pull it off she did!.
