Samuel Osborne Entertains and Talks about Human Potential and Taking a Risk

Samuel Osborne is an Australian educator, researcher and public speaker on Human Potential and Creativity. He is on a mission to serve humanity. He speaks to business groups, conducts seminars and holds private consultations.

He has completed a Bachelor of Arts in Philosophy and English, a Graduate Diploma of Education, a Certification of Neuro-Linguistic Programming, and Foundations of Anthroposophy; a formal educational, therapeutic, and creative system established by Dr. Rudolf Steiner to optimize physical and mental health and well-being. Prior to commencing his speaking career, Samuel was a Living Statue Performer, an elementary School Teacher, and Professional Beatboxing and Sound FX Artist. Samuel has over 6 years experience as a school teacher in a variety of educational settings and has taught across the K to 12 age levels within Australia. Has published a science fiction novel, interviewed over 100 creative thinkers for his podcast, Think Like a Thought Leader. In 2015, Samuel was a Finalist for Arthur Garvey Speaker of the Year Competition in Australia. Samuel's personal interests are astrophysics, comparative mythology and dream interpretation. In his spare time, he bakes banana bread.

For those fortunate enough to be at the March 29 Malibu Rotary Club they found themselves thoroughly entertained and transported by the wonderful story telling abilities of this young man, who it turns out, had only been in America for 100 days. The story of how he got to America, how he got to the Malibu Rotary Club meeting that day, and the things he had people do once he was given the stage—it was all quite remarkable.

Let's start with the fact that Sam got to the meeting to our meeting on time even though he had every reason to be late or not get there at all. After moving from Australia to America to follow his heart and the girl of his dreams whom he had met 2 years before, Sam lives in Van Nuys, California, without a car. To get the morning meeting of the Malibu Rotary club Sam decided it would be preferable to start closer to Malibu, and asked a friend in Santa Monica if he could stay overnight there. From there he would call Uber and get a ride to the Malibu Rotary Club at Pepperdine University in Malibu. After all, wasn't it just up Pacific Coast Highway a half hour a way?

Not this morning. Malibu became a lot further from Santa Monica. PCH was closed because of an auto accident and the Uber driver had to take him on the Santa Monica Freeway to the 405 to the Ventura Freeway, through the Valley where he lived, and then to Las Virgenes Canyon Rd, but after all that here he was, remarkably on time to do his show, and the show must go on!

During his presentation Samuel covers a lot of area in a very short time. He does remarkable sound effects using his voice, sounding like the bass and drum beat of a rap song, a helicopter—we guess that is what a Professional Beatboxing and Sound FX Artist does, and that alone pretty entertaining, but then he has this background something opposite—That of being a Living Statue Performer for 2 years in Perth, Australia. To do that you make no sound, make no movement, have your body completely painted bronze, are carried out on a hand truck and placed in front of the entrance to a convention center and without blinking for many minutes make a sudden movement to scare convention goers.

Samuel asks us if we have a talent that we keep to ourselves because we don't think we are good enough at this talent to let anyone know about it. In exercise he calls "Come Alive" he says that letting the world know of your talent may be very fulfilling. What will people say about your gift, your talent?

He thought his gift of making sounds would be entertaining to school children and called a 100 schools to see if he could perform, and one school responded. He was nervous the first time he did it in public but his young accident liked it, and he knew he could be successful trying other things.

Samuel told us he decided to come to America, and specifically the Los Angeles area. Two years ago he went subscribed to an online dating service in Australia. He was especially attracted to one of the girls who used this service. They met in person in a rooftop bar. They immediately were attracted to each other and dated regularly until she received a job offer from Burbank, California, USA.

He really missed her when she left. He called her and told her how he missed her and asked her if she missed him too.

She asked if her if she wanted him to come to California so they could be together. She said, "yeah."

When he came to California he found out he needed a special visa to work. When his girl friend came she already had a job. He talked to an immigration attorney who told him he could get visa to work if he married. So he asked his girl friend if she wanted to get married.

She said, "Yeah."

So they went to Las Vegas on got married. He went back to Australia and sold all his belongings and came back to America 100 days ago.

The Deadline to apply is Midnight on Sunday, April 16, 2017. NO MORE APPLICATIONS WILL BE ACCEPTED STARTING AT 12:01 A.M. ON MONDAY, APRIL 17.

Each e-mailed application received will receive a confirmation reply e-mail. If the student does not receive a confirmation e-mail within 3 days assume it has not been received by the Malibu Rotary Club.

Domestic Violence is the only diagnosis that is still shrouded in shame and often treated with contempt. There are so many misconceptions and myths about domestic violence that are simply not true. In When Loving Him Hurts we exposed what they are.

Philippa Sklaar is a survivor of abuse, author, coach and advocate. Philippa immigrated to the USA after she fled from a violently abusive marriage and resolved to learn a lesson and be more careful next time. In America she met a man who, on the surface, was everything that her second husband was not. Until she owned her own contribution to the dance of abuse

she was destined to repeat the pattern. Her story exists as proof of this. She co-wrote When Loving Him Hurts – recovery from an abusive relationship and The Affair - recovery from illicit sex, lies and betrayal. She is also the author of Hot Cuisine, and her clients included dignitaries such as Nelson Mandela and Elizabeth Taylor was her first client in LA. She appeared in the Food Network's Guy's Grocery Games

with Guy Fieri and with Margaret Cho in Blind Dinner Party.

Her commitment to reduce domestic violence led her to create a nonprofit, The Women's Voice Project. Her programs have been accepted by the LAUSD, the LAPD (Newton Division) and The California Institution for Women.

• April 19 2017 --Pepperdine professor of Political Science and author Robert Williams will be speaker at the Malibu Rotary Club meeting. His topic "The End of the American Century"—Robert Williams is Professor of Political Science at Seaver College Pepperdine University. Is is co-author of several books, including Seeking Security in an Insecure World.
