Last meeting: May 11Potpourri of news from visitors

For the past several weeks three regular visitors to the Malibu Rotary Club, **Danielle Anjou**, **Hubert Lukerath**, and **Maggie Lukerath**, have all been planning to be inducted into the club by President Elect **Kevin Boling** and also for the past several weeks, **Kevin Boling** was not there to do it. On May 11th Kevin was out showing people at CBS studios what a good trash collector he is. So this long anticipated induction is to take place the following week (May 18), on what will be a very special meeting with the guest speaker that **Bill Wishard**, invited **Pon Mon**, coming in from Las Vegas to give a presentation about Ethnic Conflict in Thailand-Possible Outcomes---and what you can do. Bangkok Thailand is the location of the 2012 Rotary International Convention.

Malibu Rotary Club President **Chris Bauman** found many things to talk about and called on several visitors at the meeting to report on events in their lives. Chris had spent the previous weekend touring the Reagan Presidential Library in Simi Valley. Reagan was an early supporter of the Pepperdine University Malibu campus and historian **David Baird** reported that he was at the campus dedication ceremony. One of the items on display at the Reagan library is a surfboard given to President Reagan by Pepperdine with a campus logo on it. Chris reported that the Malibu Rotary Club is participating in the Rotary International Youth Exchange by sponsoring **Zoe Duarte**, whom members of the club met with her mom Pam at Chris' home dinner party a few months ago, to study in Wiesbaden, Germany.

Several Malibu Rotarian are going to the Rotary District Convention in Indian Wells this weekend. **Bob Syvertsen** talked about a Rotary District Convention he attended in the 1980s that was held on a cruise ship. Except for the captain and crew, the entire ship was filled with district Rotarians. He recalled that on the first morning everyone had to get up early for lifeboat drills. District governor addressed everyone in attendance, an invocation was given, and the Rotarians were instructed to place their hands over their hearts and recite the Pledge of Allegiance to the flag, which was at the back of the ship, but could not be seen from where the people were standing. Later the captain remarked that this was quite extraordinary. When asked was extraordinary the captain said, "All these American Rotarians pledging allegiance to the Panamanian flag!"



One of the visitors at the May 11th Malibu Rotary Club meeting was Malibu Rotary Club Immediate Past President **Holmes Osborne III**. Holmes said he tries not mix Rotary and politics, but had some opinions about how the census affects congressional redistricting. Certain states, like Texas, are gaining congress people, and certain states, like Missouri, are losing congress people, based on the 2010 census. from each party live, rather that the natural geography of the area. He thinks the districts should be made up of natural boundaries and existing county and state boundaries. The shapes would be more rectangular and square, rather than odd gerrymandering shapes that dramatically change every 10 years depending on which party is in power. Rotary Japan and Pacific Islands 2011 Disaster Recovery Fund

Jim Dyer, District 5280 Disaster Relief Chair, sent the following message about what Rotary is doing through the Rotary Foundation in Japan's current emergency situation and how you can help.

The 9.0-magnitude earthquake, Japan's largest in history, caused a devastating tsunami that swept over northern coastal towns. At least 10,000 people are assumed dead, but government officials say the death toll will rise. The emergency situation is still unfolding but what is clear is the immediate need for money to support relief efforts and shelter.

In response to this massive earthquake and tsunami, The Rotary Foundation has established the *Rotary Japan & Pacific Islands Disaster Recovery Fund.* Also, ShelterBox, a designated Global Rotary Club Project, had response team members on the ground within 24 hours after the earthquake, one of the first international aid agencies to arrive in Japan. The first deployment of ShelterBoxes, including the provision of emergency shelter, water purification and lifesaving supplies are on their way to Tokyo with more on stand by.

During this initial response period we are encouraging District 5280 Clubs, Rotarian's and friends to support one of the Rotary affiliated relief efforts or other recognized international relief organizations like the Red Cross.
