Last Week's Meeting Turned Out to be a Club Assembly and Birthday Party

When scheduled speaker was a no show it afforded Malibu Rotary Club President Bill Wishard more time to talk about how he spent Memorial Day weekend. It is the way he has spent most of his Memorial Day weekends—in his home town of Indianapolis, Indiana attending the Indy 500 auto race and related festivities.

While there he remembered it was Maggie Luckerath's birthday this week (May 29) and that a year ago Maggie spent her birthday at the event she chaired, one of Malibu Rotary Club's best fundraisers, the Brazilian Bash Blowout at Chris Bosh's house. Bill remembers that on that day he tried to attend the affair but was



not allowed out of his the rehab center following his recent heart surgery. He vowed not to miss Maggie's birthday this year and had the Malibu Rotary Club meeting May 28 end in an ad lib birthday party and gave Maggie Indy race birthday gifts he brought back with him.

Bill gave a couple of "Happy Dollars" to the club, related to things about the race. This year's Indy 500 was the safest and fastest race in history. He said those two factors were related. During crashes the race is slowed and since there were no major crashes the race went start to finish without stoppage for crash clearance. Bill also attended the post race VIP dinner and met the winner.

As we all know Bill is friends with the Parnelli Jones family since Bill and Parnelli's son Page were in rehab together following auto accidents in which they each suffered brain injuries. Bill said that usually when he calls the house and Parnelli answers Parnelli passes the phone off to his wife or Page, but this week on his return from the big race Parnelli actually wanted to talk to Bill, to get first hand reports about this year's race.

Bill also said that Page, who never spoke in public until Bill encouraged him to speak at the Malibu Rotary Club several years ago, has become a popular public speaker since then and the subject of a movie. Bill said that he will be attending a dinner in Riverside, a fund raiser for the Page Jones Foundation, where Page will be addressing an audience of 1500 people.

Other News and Guests at the Last Malibu Rotary Club meeting

David Zielski had time to talk more about his Raincatcher projects in Kenya and Uganda. He had returned and spoke about these briefly at our last meeting. The latest new Raincatcher installation was sponsored by the Entebbe Rotary Club. The projects help 50,000 people get clean drinking water. There was a videographer on the trip who video recorded 13 days and David will be presenting a report to our club at a future meeting after these video recordings are edited. On each trip David does multiple things, including helping with new Raincatcher installations,, maintaining older installations, and checking on the automatic 6 month inspection of the most recent installations. He points out how previously installed wells, a popular previous source of water, fail after a few years, and a big part of what Raincatcher does is not just provide a source of clean water, but a *sustainable* source of clean water. When he goes back to the schools where earlier Raincatcher installations have been done the leaders tell him of all the side benefits of Raincatcher—the health of the students allow them to stay in school, get an education, which helps them economically, and it has even helps reduce HIV.

At least two people from the Malibu Rotary Club must be certified online by the Rotary Foundation in order for the Malibu Rotary to be eligible for Rotary Foundation grant money.

Bill Wishard, David Zielski, and Hubert Luckerath are all working toward that certification.
