"And
Then
There
Were
Eight"

Actress Kimberly Russell and husband Michael Bonewitz, who met on a movie set, find themselves living a real life drama "And Then There Were Eight." Kimberly and her husband already had 3 happy young children at home. The number of children at home grew suddenly to 8 when they agreed to take care of the 5 children of a single mom who died shortly after being diagnosed with lung cancer.

The unexpected new chapter in the lives of the Bonewitz family started innocently enough when Kim was at a PTA meeting in June, 2012. There was one mom there, Marie Jordanou, who looked somewhat ill and Kim knew this single mom was struggling with 5 children. Marie's children were friends of Kim's children.

There were leftover refreshments at the PTA meeting, and Kim told Marie that she would put the the left overs in a bag so Marie could take them home for her kids. When the meeting ended Marie asked Kim where the left over food items were, and when Kim looked for them they were gone--somebody had thrown them in the trash. Before Kim left she saw Marie foraging through the trash for the bag of left overs. She told Michael about it and he gave Marie money to buy the kids food.

From then on Kim took a special interest in Marie and her family--she could tell Marie did the best she could with her 5 children, which included 9 year old twins, a 10 year old, a 13 year old and a 15 year old.

Marie had been a real estate mortgage broker, but had been unable to work for quite some time because of lung cancer, which progressed ultimately to Stage IV and had metastasized to various organs in her body. Marie's husband had left her and the kids, and although Marie had sisters, they all lived in Europe and offered no help. Her medical bills had been astronomical, and the family home was in danger of foreclosure. Savings had been exhausted. Kim became friends with Marie and she and Michael tried to help her in any way they could. At this point it was only these PTA friends that offered any help for the physical and emotional burden that consumed her.

Michael, who is a motion picture camerman and electrician, set up a fundraising concert in February to make more people in the community aware of the Jordanou family predicament help take care of the raising expenses. He and Kim were trying to rescue the family and he started a nonprofit charity and to publicicize it website http://www.jordanourescue.org/.

Kim tried to stay in regular contact with Marie. When she learned that Marie had been taken to the hospital she went to the hospital. When she arrived at the hospital and explained she was a close family friend she was allowed into an ICU room where Marie was laying, surrounded by the 5 children and a priest. The cancer had matasticized to her brain and she was given 4 days to live. Kim became part of the Jordanou family, and Kim visited Marie everyday in the hospital. While in the hospital Marie asked Kim a favor, "Would you take my children?"

When Kim went home she told David of Marie's request. Kim laughs when she tells us how David balked at an earlier request when she had asked him if they could get a puppy for their 3 children. He talked about having another mouth to feed. And now she was asking him to take in 5 human children. How would he react to that? Well, Michael was adopted and one of the things he loves about Kim is "her big heart." He was expecting it might come to this. And of course-Yes. He would do it. They would do it. He would do everything in his power to make sure Kim's promise to Marie would be honored. Marie's children would stay together When you see this couple together you can see how much love and devotion they have for each other and how much love and care they will have for an expanded family.

Marie wanted to live, to take care of her children. She lived another 9 months, beyond that day in the ICU, with Marie trying many things to try to improve her health--a holistic diet, praying in buddhist temples, catholic churches, Jewish temples, with Michael taking her to these places.

At one point doctors decided to surgically remove the tumor from Marie's brain. Before the surgery Marie asked David to take her to a Buddhist Temple to chant, which they did. After doing pre-op blood tests they were told they weren't going to do the surgery.

Kim works as an actress. She was in the academy award winning 2009 movie *Precious*. It is therefore up to Michael to do the bulk of taking care of the kids, although all of the family has to adjust their schedules to accommodate each other.

On November 12th Kim and Michael are going to court to get legal custody of the Jordanou kids

. When asked what their biggest challenges have been Michael said that having the 5 kids who are mourning their mother's passing, and having 3 kids who are now having to share their parents is a challenge, but his kids are generally are happy and smiling, and that happiness is contagious to the other 5.

Michael plays guitar and all the children play musical instruments. Kim said that one day he heard the 10 year old twin boys crying when nobody else was around. When she asked him why he was crying he replied, "I miss my Mom.." He didn't want to cry in front of his brothers and sisters because he wanted to stay strong for them.

Another challenge for Michael and Kim was getting all the kids to school. With 8 kids and driver they had to make multiple trips each day. That particular problem was solved when they were able to purchase a used 10 passenger van.

On the Joradaou Rescue website Michael explains that he started the non-profit organization Jordanou Rescue to help not only Maria, but other single parent cancer victims with kids, who need help beyond what medical treatment can offer:

Why We Do It

"Compassion; to witness a friend or neighbor carrying the burden of financial hardship, all alone and with mouths to feed is tough enough. Now add to that a diagnosis of very serious cancer. The weight of which must be crushing and our hearts can only go out to that friend or neighbor. It's difficult to imagine what it must be like to suffer from possibly terminal cancer, undergoing debilitating therapy treatments while fighting every day for your life and praying that this will not be the last time you say goodbye to your young children. Couple this with all the everyday domestic and parental duties, the inability to work or even get up and it is obvious help is greatly needed. We do it because, how could we not? We do it because we believe someone would do it for us. We do it because we are human. We do it because a single parent with cancer cannot do it by themselves. Compassion, sympathy, simple human dignity, these are basic motivating factors that drive us to provide aid to others."
