Dr. Michael Ye Tells the Story About a Subject the Chinese Government Doesn't Want You to Know: The Renaissance of Chinese Culture

## -And the Show the Chinese Government Doesn't Want you to see: Shen Yun

The November 9<sup>th</sup> program of the Malibu Rotary Club was presented by Dr. Michael Ye, who received his Ph.D. degree from the School of Policy, Planning and Development, University of Southern California (USC) in 2007. As a scholar coming from China, Dr. Ye has been actively involved in community events and promotion of the traditional Chinese culture. He helped organize cultural events and supports nonprofit organizations dedicated to Chinese culture.

Dr Ye's colorful PowerPoint presentation deals with the 5,000 year history of Chinese culture. China ia known as "The Land of the Divine."

The **Yellow Emperor** or **Huangdi**<sup>1</sup> is a legendary Chinese sovereign and culture hero,<sup>[3]</sup> included among the Three Sovereigns and Five Emperors.<sup>[4]</sup> Tradition holds that he reigned from 2696–2598 BC. Traditionally credited with numerous inventions and innovations, he is regarded as the initiator of Chinese civilization. In traditional Chinese accounts, the Yellow Emperor is credited with improving the livelihood of the nomadic hunters of his tribe. He teaches them how to build shelters, tame wild animals. He invents carts, boats, and clothing. While Taoism is often regarded in the West as arising from Laozi, Chinese Taoists claim the Yellow Emperor formulated many of their precepts.

There are three main spiritual leaders of China: Lao Zi, Buddha (who came from India), and Confucius. Lao's Daoism features Truth and Truthfulness. Buddha features Compassion and Benevolence, and Confuscianism features Humanity, Justice, Courtesy, Wisdom, Integrity, Tolerance, Loyalty and Filial Piety.

Traditional Chinese Culture incorporates Oneness of Man and Heaven, "Good begets Good, Evil begets Evil," Uphold High Moral Standards and Cultivation of Virtue and Harmony among Different Teachings. Virtues historical figures are historian Dong Hu, Official Yan Zhen, and Prime Minister Wen.

Chinese rich tradition was destroyed by the Chinese Communist Party (CCP). The party was founded in July, 1921 in Shanghai. After a lengthy civil war, the party defeated its primary rival, the Kuomintang (KMT), and expanded into all of mainland China by 1949. It changed the moral fabric of the country. It persecuted millions of intellectuals and spiritual cultivators. It instigated destruction of traditional culture and values by using Power and Violence. Although Communism espoused to make everyone equal it caused a class struggle, and there were no longer universal shared values. There was no respect for the Devine and atheism was the law. Classic works and antiques were labeled as "four old" (thought, culture, custom, habit) and destroyed.

There was and is culture and art in China, but under the CCP, it is without traditional values, and is only allowed if it celebrates the ideas of the Communist Party. Dr Ye's presentation shows what happens with the destruction of traditional values,

Certain people, like Li Hongzhe, felt there was a need to retune to traditional values. He founded **Falun Gong** (literally means "*Dharma Wheel Practice*",<sup>[1]</sup> alternatively **Falun Dafa**) a spiritual discipline first introduced in China in 1992 It combines the practice of meditation and slow-moving qigong exercises with the moral philosophy. Falun Gong places a heavy emphasis on morality and the cultivation of virtue in its central tenets of Truthfulness, Compassion, and Forbearance (Chinese: 真、善、忍), and identifies as a qigong practice of the Buddhist school, though its teachings also incorporate elements drawn from Taoist traditions.

People who practice Falun Gong could easily be Rotarians, and some of them are. Doesn't Truthfulness, Compassion, and Forbearance sound a lot like the Rotary 4 Way Test. Doesn't compassion lead to "Service Above Self?"

Falun Gong doctrine also counsels against participation in political or social issues. Excessive interest in politics is viewed as an attachment to worldly power and influence, and Falun Gong aims for transcendence of such pursuits. According to Hu Ping, "Falun Gong deals only with purifying the individual through exercise, and does not touch on social or national concerns. It has not suggested or even intimated a model for social change. Many religions...pursue social reform to some extent...but there is no such tendency evident in Falun Gong."

The 5,000 year history of China, with its emphasis on the tradition of virtue and morality, is the basis of **Shen Yun Performing Arts**, formerly known as **Divine Performing Arts**. It performs classical Chinese dance, ethnic and folk dance, and story-based dance.

Founded in 2006, the Shen Yun troupe is often associated with the Falun Gong spiritual practice, and performances around the world are hosted by local Falun Dafa Associations. Kelly Wen, Master of Ceremonies for Shen Yun, stated that the underlying idea of the performance is to "revive the essence of 5000 years of Chinese culture", which Wen described as a lost art destroyed by the Chinese communist government.



Among others, the show has been praised by Broadway critic Richard Connema, who gave it five stars. Shen Yun has than 200 more who members perform around the world seven months a year. The show's acts and production staff are trained at Shen Yun's

headquarters in Cuddebackville, in Orange County, New York. Shen Yun shows feature traditional Chinese dance and song. A January 2010 seven-show run of Shen Yun at the Kennedy Center Opera House in Washington, DC, consisted of twenty-two vignettes with colorful costumes, dancing, and "thrilling operatic singing".

Shen Yun enacts three distinct forms of Chinese dance in its performances: classical Chinese dance, ethnic and folk dance (for instance, dances of China's Dai and Mongolian ethnic minorities), and story-based dance, presenting classic Chinese stories such as the legend of Mulan.

Aside from the dance pieces, there is also a live orchestra of Chinese and Western instruments. The songs are in Chinese, but the lyrics, both in Chinese and the local language where the performance is being held (English in the US), are projected onto a backdrop revealing the performances' themes, "dealing often with historical movements and their devoted disciples."

The group is composed of three performing arts companies: The New York Company, The Touring Company, and the International Company, which typically tour different parts of the world consecutively. Each year the Shen Yun Performing Arts show tours several countries, performing across Europe, North America, Oceania, and Asia.

The June 10 *Epoch Times* wrote about some of the attempts of the Chinese current government to block performance of *Shen Yun* show not only in China, but wherever the show tours around the world.

On Feb. 9, 2009, Mr. McMillan-Scott held a welcoming party for Shen Yun's 2009 European tour, attended by more than 100 people, including many European parliamentarians, their assistants, and stewards. Mr. McMillan-Scott said the show "is a contemporary historic poem that can be enjoyed by both Easterners and Westerners."

British MEP Mr. Barden said, "Tell everyone, go see the show, feel it and do your best to support the meaning behind it."

Disregarding pressure from the CCP, 25 members of the Swedish Parliament published a joint statement in 2008, saying they were going to see Shen Yun, adding, "We warmly welcome the first visit of the Divine Performing Arts to Sweden! We, members of different political parties in the Swedish Parliament, condemn the Chinese Embassy for violating freedom of speech in our country." Shen Yun was also called Divine Performing Arts.

In 2007, the Chinese Embassy had also threatened Swedish Culture Committee Chief Johan Lundgren. Mr. Lundgren said the CCP's threats were empty and caused no problems with Swedish-China relations. "I was very clear on the fact that freedom of expression is applied here," he said.

In many other countries, politicians and public leaders learned of, and went to see Shen Yun, only after receiving threats from the CCP not to see the show.

During a Shen Yun performance in Canada in 2007, the Chinese Embassy sent letters and made calls to various government offices. Canadian Prime Minister Stephen Harper personally sent a congratulatory letter to Shen Yun and Environment Minister John Baird attended the show to personally relay congratulations from the PM.

Also in 2007, California's Chairman of Orange County's Board of Supervisors Chris Norby received a letter from the Chinese consulate in Los Angeles requesting he not see the show. Mr. Norby responded by saying, "Your request is an insult to me. Of course I will not comply." In late January 2010, the government of Hong Kong refused entry visas for members of the production crew for the troupe's performances scheduled between 27 and 31 January, saying that "work visas were considered case by case", and said the applicant generally had to offer expertise not easily found locally; the troupe cancelled the performances which it claimed to have been sold out. Democratic Party chairman Albert Ho said the denial of the visas was a worrying new erosion of Hong Kong's freedoms, and damaged the reputation of Hong Kong as a liberal and open society.



Hope we will not be intimidated by Chinese government officials in Southern California for the performances scheduled Jan 11-12 and Segerstrom Center for the Arts or Jan 13-14 at the Dorothy Chandler Pavilion.

Marine Sargent Winston Fiore Started his 5,000 mile Cross Country Motorcycle Trip in Malibu. His purpose is to bring awareness of children's cleft palette and raise money for the International Children's Surgical Foundation. The organization provides

surgery, training for 3<sup>rd</sup> world surgeons, plus follow-up care for surgical correction of children's cleft palette disease. The US trip was in preparation for a 5,000 mile walking trip across Southeast Asia. He explains, "In late September, 2011, I will set out on a 5,000-mile walk through Southeast Asia. My route will take me through eight different countries, beginning and ending in Singapore, and the yearlong trek will be an ongoing effort to raise funds for the ICSF and awareness for children living with clefts in the developing world. I chose to base this trip in Southeast Asia because of the region's high prevalence of cleft births." Malibu Rotary Club is one of his sponsors. One surgery costs \$240.
