

They meet every Thursday night at 7 pm at Webster Elementary School on 3602 Winter Canyon Road in Malibu.

## **PCH Safety Study**

The PCH Safety Study will examine current conditions along the corridor and identify safety concerns based on roadway conditions, adjacent land-uses and other factors that may be unique to Malibu and PCH. The study will conclude with recommendations for prioritized improvements along each of the three defined study areas, recognizing there may be differences within each study area requiring separate analysis. The study area boundaries include: Study Area 1: Topanga Canyon Rd. to Cross Creek Rd.; Study Area 2: Cross Creek Rd. to Busch Dr.; and, Study Area 3: Busch Dr. to Western City Limits. There will be public meetings to discuss existing conditions at the Malibu City Hall, 23825 Stuart Ranch Road, in Malibu at 6:00 pm to 8:00 pm on 4 successive Thursdays starting with September 13. Each meeting will discuss a different area of PCH. September 13 with study Area 1, September 20<sup>th</sup> Area 2, September 27<sup>th</sup> Area 3, and the final meeting on October 4<sup>th</sup> will discuss all 3 Study Areas. Six candidates are in the race. They include incumbents Jose Escarce, Maria Leon Vazquez and Ben Allen, as well as Malibu school activists Karen Farrer, Craig Foster and Seth Jacobson. The forum will draw on questions from the Malibu and Santa Monica communities. There will be a short 6:45 p.m. Malibu Rotary Club meeting prior to the Candidates forum. This meeting will be in lieu of the normal morning Malibu Rotary Club in the Fireside Room and no food will be served.

Marine Sargent Winston Fiore Started his 5,000 mile Cross Country Motorcycle Trip in Malibu. His purpose is to bring awareness of children's cleft palette and raise money for the International Children's Surgical Foundation. The organization provides surgery, training for 3<sup>rd</sup> world surgeons, plus follow-up care for surgical correction of children's cleft palette disease. The US trip was in preparation for a 5,000 mile walking trip across Southeast Asia which he began in September. Before he left he explained " My route will take me through eight different countries, beginning and ending in Singapore, and the yearlong trek will be an ongoing effort to raise funds for the ICSF and awareness for children living with clefts in the developing world. I chose to base this trip in Southeast Asia because of the region's high prevalence of cleft births."
