Malibu Rotary Club Hosted Santa Monica-Malibu School Board Candidates Forum October 15 at Pepperdine



The Malibu Rotary Club hosted a public forum on October 15th at Pepperdine University featuring the candidates running for the 2014 Santa Monica-Malibu Unified School District Board. The forum was moderated by Parents Advocate League (parentsadvocateleague.org) Founder and CEO Julie Collier (L), who, along with an audience of 38 from the community, posed questions to the 7 candidates.

There are four new positions opened in 2014 for the 7 members comprising the board. Three current board members are running for reelection, Laurie Lieberman, Ralph Mechur (current board vice president), and Oscar de la Torre. All of them, along with candidate Richard Tahvildaran-Jesswein, have been endorsed by Santa Monicans for Renters Rights. No candidate for school board, Santa Monica City Council, Santa Monica Rent Control Board, or Santa Monica College Trustee, has won an election in Santa Monica without endorsement of SMRR. Although the SMMUSD board governs the schools in Malibu, only 20% of the voters are in Malibu, which has made it difficult for a Malibu candidate to become elected. In 2012 three Malibu candidates ran, including current candidate Craig Foster, but none were elected.

The discussion at the October 15th forum often became heated, especially when the subject was PCBs (polychlorinated biphenyls) found in Malibu schools (and which probably exists in Santa Monica schools), and what the best course of action should be to test for and eliminate them. There is a good chance that any building built between 1950 and 1980 has used the carcinogenic PCBs in caulking buildings during their construction. Some in the audience did not feel the current board has not done proper testing, that the teachers and children should not go back into the buildings, and should instead be relocated to temporary trailers, until all tests show there is no hazard. Among those in the audience was actress/model Cindy Crawford, who, along with her husband Rande Gerber, are not convinced that testing done by SMMUSD is adequate, and have volunteered to pay for the testing themselves to make sure the classrooms are safe.

Although the Q & A after the moderator's questions were dominated by the PCB problem, there were other issues as well.

All candidates agreed there should be better representation of Malibu at the SMMUSD Board meetings, and advocated that even if Malibu's lone candidate (Craig Foster) is not elected as one of the 4 new board members there should be a liaison position created to make sure Malibu is represented at each board meeting. Each candidate also said that there should be more board meetings held in Malibu (this year there was only one in 6 months). There are 5 SMMUSD board meetings scheduled in Malibu in the next 8 months. School board meetings are scheduled

at Malibu City Hall on November 6 and December 11, 2014, as well as February 5, March 19, and May 2015.

Some of the other questions asked of the candidates had to do with who the candidates supported as California State Superintendent of Education between incumbent Tom Torlakson and newcomer challenger Marshall Tuck and how each candidate stands on teacher tenure.

In general there seemed to be a consensus among the candidates that the current 2 years for a teacher to be working in the district to gain tenure is too short.

Rotary connections—Two of the candidates have past connections to Rotary. Richard Tahvildaran-Jesswein was a student at RYLA camp as a high school student, and candidate Oscar de la Torre, who was a member of the Santa Monica Rotary Club, quoted the Rotary 4 Way Test, when assessing the PCB issue:

Is it the TRUTH?

Is it FAIR to all concerned?

Does it promote GOOD WILL AND BETTER FRIENDSHIP?

Will it be BENEFICIAL to all concerned?

Indeed, it is the standard to be applied to all the things we do or say.

All the candidates promised to dedicate themselves to providing the best education for children in the safest environment. The voters will decide on November 4th which ones will succeed in their mission.

Malibu Rotary Club Supports RainCatcher

Malibu Rotary—Home Club of RainCatcher Executive Director David Zielski

Every 21 seconds, a child dies from a water-related illness. Women and children spend 200 million hours a day collecting water.

There are over a billion people who do not have access to clean drinking water. RainCatcher is efficiently doing something to try to reduce that number. They get low cost, low maintenance and sustainable water systems to Uganda and Kenya so women and children have a safe and close water source.

Besides the obvious health benefits, providing a local and safe water source multiple other social, economical, and educational benefits also accrue. There can be an increased girls' school attendance, level of education and literacy rates, as they no longer need to miss school to secure water for their families and have adequate and separate sanitation facilities.

There can also be reduced physical injury from constant lifting and carrying heavy loads of water, reduced risk of rape, sexual assault, and increased safety as women and girls do not have to go to remote and dangerous places to defecate or to fetch water during the night.

The Malibu Rotary Club along with the Rotary Clubs of Beverly Hills, CA USA and the Rotary Club of Entebbe, Uganda has applied for a Rotary Foundation Grant to assist Raincatcher.

There are several videos available on You Tube that show the amazing things Raincatcher is doing bringing clean drinking water to places in Uganda and Kenya where there was previously
no



clean drinking water. David Zielski, Executive Director of Raincatcher, makes regular trips to Uganda and Kenya to do Raincatcher installations and maintenance. National Veterans Foundation--Vietnam Veterans Re-Socialization



This is the first of a 4 part series the Malibu Rotary Club will present about the aftermath that still exists as the result of American involvement in the Vietnamese war.

For more than 40 years, NVF Founder and President Shad Meshad has worked as a therapist for veterans and an advocate for veterans' rights. After receiving his master's degree in psychiatric social work from Florida State University, he enlisted in the army in 1970, and served as a counselor for U.S. soldiers in Vietnam.

Upon his return to the U.S., Meshad founded and directed the Vietnam Veterans Re-Socialization Unit at the VA Hospital in Los Angeles, California. It was the first program of its kind, focusing on the readjustment problems of Vietnam veterans. During this time, Meshad was among the first to study the disorder now known as Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder, or PTSD.

In 1978, he worked to develop and lobby for the National Vietnam Veterans Readjustment Bill. In 1979, he founded the Vet Center Outreach Program, which now serves veterans in more than 200 locations across the country.
