

The October 16 meeting of the Malibu Rotary Club Assembly led by Malibu Rotary Club President Bill Wishard.

The meeting dealt with several topics put before and voted on by the general membership of the

Malibu Rotary Club, including the charity budget, and new members to be inducted the following week, the reactivation of Pepperdine Rotaract Club, as well as the venue, price, and menu of the annual Malibu Rotary Club Holiday Party to be held on Wednesday evening, December 11.

Charity Budget Items Approved

Family in need

\$250 Kim and Michael have 3 children of their own. The number of their children grew suddenly to 8 when they agreed to take care of the 5 children of a single mom who died shortly after being diagnosed with lung cancer. Normally the Malibu Rotary Club does not donate to individuals or families, but Maggie Luckerath believes we should make an exception this case. Kim's moving story will be told at the November 6 Malibu Rotary Club meeting at noon in LC 153 of the Pepperdine Malibu Grazadio Graduate campus.

Sponsor Little League

request \$850 Other service clubs in Malibu sponsor Little Teams and Malibu Rotary Club President Bill Wishard said that request of Malibu Rotary Club sponsorship has come to him. Sponsorship gives community exposure of Malibu Rotary Club in addition fulfilling two of Rotary's chief Avenues of Service--Youth Service and Community Service.

Raincatcher \$1000 (of ca \$50,000) with Entebbe Rotary Club in Africa and Other Local Rotary Clubs such as Beverly Hills Rotary Club. At the September 25th meeting of the Malibu Rotary Club soon-to-be Malibu Rotarian David Zielski, who is Executive Director Raincatcher showed presentation on how his company brings and maintains clean drinking water to villages in Africa who need it (See http://www.clubrunner.ca/Data/5280/2529/HTML/210127//MalibuRotaryClubSurfwriterSeptem ber252013.pdf). Malibu Rotary Club has committed \$1000 to be part of a project that costs close to \$50,000. This project should qualify for Rotary Foundation matching grants.

Anti-Graffiti (with district 5280) \$250 Malibu Rotary Club Presdent Bill Wishard recommended the Malibu Rotary Club participate in a Rotary district project that removes graffiti in public places -- soon to be Malibu Rotarian **Kelly Sagona** says she has been working with the Boys & Girls Club on Graffiti Removal Project and she already has volunteers lined up for the B & G Club Graffit Project which could be combined with the Rotary effort.

Tip for Brazilian Bash \$300 Soon to be Rotarian **Bill Krenz** not only catered the successful the Malibu Rotary Club Brazilian Bash Blowout fundraiser held last May 29th, but also supplied the fire dancers. Normally the dancers would get \$300, and and although the Malibu Rotary Club paid for the food, they didn't pay the tip for the dancers. Bill paid the dancers. This was another item approved for the budget.

Total: \$2800

It was voted and approved that these amounts be set aside from our charity budget (some of which may come out of the profits from the Brazilian Bash Blowout).

Reactivation of the Pepperdine Rotaract Club

The Malibu Rotary Club had sponsored one of the Pepperdine Univerity's most successful campus club, the Pepperdine Rotaract Club, with the faculty sponsorship of Connie James. After Connie stepped down from faculty sponsorship of the club a couple years ago the Pepperdine Rotaract Club has been dormant. Many Pepperdine students are familiar with Rotary, having been Interact club leaders in high school, or having been youth exchange students or going to RYLA camps. In fact we have met some of these students who stay in touch with their Interact and other Rotary student contacts thorugh social media. They expected there to be a Pepperdine Rotaract Club but there hasn't been one for lack of a faculty mentor. David Baird, who has been a Rotarian for many years, both in Malibu and in Oklahoma, and of course is Dean Emeritus and History Professor of Pepperdine University Seaver College has felt the pressure from these student and announced at the Malibu Rotary Club of October 16 to be faculty sponsor of Pepperdine Rotaract Club. The Malibu Rotary Club received the following e-mail from Kristina Kell of Advocates for Malibu Public Schools. We may have its advocat Craig Foster as speaker at a future Malibu Rotary Club meeting to further state the position of AAMPS. He spoke to us along with the other candidates for school board as part of the SMMUSD School Board Candidates Forum last year when he unsuccessfully ran for the school board.

Hi, My name is Kristina Kell, I live in the Point Dume Club I am hosting an AMPS meeting at the clubhouse October 21st at 6:00, with another resident. AMPS stands for Advocates for Malibu Public Schools. We are the group that is advocating separating our Malibu schools from Santa Monica control. Right now, Santa Monica controls our schools, our tax money and our kids education, we want to put a stop to that. I am contacting you because, we are sending out invitations, advertising and posting signs about the meeting this week. I was hoping that you would send out a few announcements to your members about this meeting, since it will effect everybody here in Malibu. People can ask questions, inquire about taxes, and understand what the process entails. Let me know your thoughts. Thanks Kristina Kell

How will separation effect you, our community? Come learn about the process, and ask question about the timeline and the benefits of forming and controlling our own school district.

October 24th is WORLD POLIO DAY

Julie Jenkins, of the Rotary Club of Burbank Sunrise, visited the Malibu Rotary Club last year as Rotary Assistant District 5280 Governor. This year Julie, who is a victim of polio, has been named Rotary District Polio Plus Chairperson.

She has written the following:

The Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation has generously provided a new challenge to help meet the U.S. \$1.5B funding gap in the strategic campaign to eradicate polio by 2018. Through June 2018, the first \$35 million donated via Rotary to the Polio Plus Fund each year

will generate a \$2 matching contribution from the Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation. This is a fantastic opportunity for every participant to see his or her donations quickly expand to inoculate three times as many children.

\$1 donated through Rotary + \$2 contributed by Gates Foundation = \$3 total funding = 6 children inoculated

\$35 million donated through Rotary + \$70 million contributed by Gates Foundation = \$105 million total funding = 175 million children inoculated
