

Visiting Rotarian Gordon Shurtleff Makes RC Malibu his 251st Make Up as Malibu Rotary Club Plans for District Gov DJ Visit



Malibu Rotary Club President Dave Zielski Exchanges Rotary Banners with Visiting Rotarian Gordon Shurtleff of the Torrey Pines (La Jolla) Rotary Club of District 5340 in northern San Diego County. For Gordon he made the Rotary Club of Malibu his 251st club visit, after making his 250th visit the one last week to Koreatown Rotary Club, home of Rotary District Governor DJ Sun, who will be visiting Malibu Rotary Club Plan officially next week. Gordon has been club president twice, the last time 2013-2014, when he met Bill Wishard at PETS, and Bill invited him to come to Malibu.

Besides Gordon Shurtleff there were several other guests at the Malibu Rotary Club meeting Sept 16, including Gordon's wife Penny Shurtleff who was the first woman to join the Santa Rosa Rotary Club. In fact she was one of the first women Rotarians anywhere. That was in 1987. On 4 May 1987, the U.S. Supreme Court rules that Rotary clubs may not exclude women from membership on the basis of gender. Rotary issues a policy statement that any Rotary club in the United States can admit qualified women into membership and Penny was one of the first. Penny explained how that same year her father had become ill and how Rotary saved his life. Another guest at the meeting was Mark Persson Executive Director of the Malibu Chamber of Commerce, who is to be inducted as a member of the Malibu Rotary Club at the next meeting.

Other guests at the Sept 16 Malibu Rotary Club meeting included **Lisa Nickmeyer** a realtor from Westlake Village, and Swiss Rotary Ambassadorial Scholar **Livia Giordano** whom the Malibu Rotary Club hosted 3 years ago while she attended and earned a Masters degree at the Pepperdine Strauss School of Dispute Resolution at the Pepperdine Law School. After graduation Livia had remained in the United States and just finished a 6 month 18,000 mile tour of the United States alone, just her and 2 cats, in a 31 foot Winnebago. Livia has made many friends in America, and would stay here if there was a job opportunity that would extend her visa, but alas, she was tearfully bidding farewell, to her local friends as she made final arrangements to return to the country of her birth. We hope to stay in touch with social media and hope to see Livia again in the not too distant future.

Screenings of Page Jones Movie "GodSpeed"

Bill Wishard reminds us via two links: http://goo.gl/Sgt9ZS and www.godspeedtickets.squarespace.com that screening of "Godspeed", the movie of Page Jones life will be on October 2 at the Laemmle Playhouse 7 in Pasadena and also at Oct. 9 - AMC Loews Village 7 in New York City. Screenings at these theaters on both coasts qualifies film for Academy Award consideration in the documentary category.

The movie tells the story of Page Jones, son of racing royal Parnelli Jones, who finds his path to speedway stardom derailed by a near-fatal accident that challenges him -and his

family- to redefine victory. Page met Bill while both were recovering from near fatal traumatic brain injuries at Daniel Freeman Hospital in Inglewood, CA. Both spent many month months there trying to make some sense of their lives. After Page's injury previously flamboyant racing star had never appeared in public nor gave a speech until Bill encouraged him to be brought to a Malibu Rotary Club meeting and be interviewed by Bill in front of the club as part of that day's Malibu Rotary Club program. After that initial small public exposure Page was asked to do programs at other Rotary Clubs, and Rotary District Conferences and became a positive spokesperson for people with traumatic brain injuries and he ultimately became the movie, which written and directed Luann subject of this was by Mary and produced Leonard by Executive producers are Jay Leno & Bruce Meyer.

GODSPEED chronicles 21 years of Page's recovery. In devoting themselves to Page's rehabilitation, the Jones Family redefines victory and their own legacy. They want the world to know that Page is living proof that with support, quality lives are within reach. Access to long-term rehabilitation is critical but frequently unavailable for most TBI victims because it requires a community of devoted individuals - family, friends, medical professionals - all working towards recovery.

The financial and social impact of TBI has reached epidemic proportions. GODSPEED is a long-overdue look at the true cost of what it takes - in time, money, and spirit- to recover from a brain injury. Running Time of movie is 75 minutes.

PREMIERE EVENT is Friday, October 2 from 5:00pm Outside Laemmle Playhouse 7. There will be a Q &A with Jones family after the 7:20 p.m. screening, with festivities continuing to 10:00 p.m. both at theater and at Vroman's Courtyard in Pasadena.
