Malibu Rotary Club Annual Malibu High School and Middle School Singing Competition

John Elman gave a report on this annual event, which awards prizes to top three contestants from Middle School Division and top three contestants from High School Division in a vocal competition hosted by the Malibu Rotary Club. Winner of the high school competition will be sponsored by the Malibu Rotary Club to compete in Rotary District Music Competition held at Loyola Marymont University in March. Amy Loch, choral director of Malibu Middle School and Malibu High School has worked closely with the Malibu Rotary Club Chair of the event, auditioning contestants, supplying piano accompaniment, and making sure each show is professionally done. Although the competition has taken place in various venues, including a local restaurant (Beurivage), Serra Retreat, Malibu High School auditorium, Raitt Recital Hall and Stauffer Chapel at Pepperdine, the latter venue has been favored the past several years. Chris Bauman has secured the space at the Chapel and has brought in the sound system (microphones). This year Kelly Sagona suggested that the competition be opened up to vocalists from the OLM middle school.

Chair of the event for the Malibu Rotary Club for the past dozen has been Geoff Ortiz, 2 time club President, long time Youth Chair, who is no longer an active member of the club. Yes, Bill's happy dollars came with pictures, having not only to do with him and his famous medical family, but Rotary contributions in Indianapolis.

On a recent visit back home to Indianapolis, Bill was given a special tour of the new hospital which was originally started by his grandfather, the original William Niles Wishard, MD. The original hospital had many firsts—it was the first community hospital in Indiana; it had the first nursing program; it had the first ambulance service (horse and buggy) west of New York. It was Wishard Hospital for years, but a new modern hospital has taken its place. The new hospital has a Starbucks coffee facility in the lobby, and part of the design made it different from any other Starbucks. It features pictures of the old hospital, ambulance, etc., and also its founder William N Wishard MD. In picture Bill is seen in that Starbucks posing with his grandfather's picture.

Bill's tour not only included a tour of the new hospital but a tour of certain old buildings which are still used, including the Rotary Indiana Convalescent Hospital, which was built in 1931 with money raised by local Rotary Clubs. The medical facilities started by the Wishard family are now part of Indian University.

Malibu Rotary Club Supports RainCatcher

Malibu Rotary—Home Club of RainCatcher Executive Director David Zielski

Every 21 seconds, a child dies from a water-related illness. Women and children spend 200 million hours a day collecting water.

There are over a billion people who do not have access to clean drinking water. RainCatcher is efficiently doing something to try to reduce that number. They get low cost, low maintenance and sustainable water systems to Uganda and Kenya so women and children have a safe and close water source.

Besides the obvious health benefits, providing a local and safe water source multiple other social, economical, and educational benefits also accrue. There can be an increased girls' school attendance, level of education and literacy rates, as they no longer need to miss school to secure water for their families and have adequate and separate sanitation facilities.

There can also be reduced physical injury from constant lifting and carrying heavy loads of water, reduced risk of rape, sexual assault, and increased safety as women and girls do not have to go to remote and dangerous places to defecate or to fetch water during the night.

The Malibu Rotary Club along with the Rotary Clubs of Beverly Hills, CA USA and the Rotary Club of Entebbe, Uganda has applied for a Rotary Foundation Grant to assist Raincatcher.

There are several videos available on You Tube that show the amazing things Raincatcher is doing bringing clean drinking water to places in Uganda and Kenya where there was previously

clean drinking water. David Zielski, Executive Director of Raincatcher, makes regular trips to Uganda and Kenya to do Raincatcher installations and maintenance.
