Celebrate Manhattan Beach

Good Works

Loli Ramezani presented our check to Shoes That Fit, a group that provides new shoes to elementary school children in L.A. County schools, especially in our locality in Lawndale schools. We heard about their program from Manhattan Beach mom (with an accent that sounded a lot like Roger Cox) Vicki Tyler and Jorge Arroyo.....We learned that Bill Bloomfield is now dealing with his own cancer, but with a favorable prognosis (with, however, strenuous treatment).....Nelson Gray filled us in on our ongoing scholarship program at Central High, where he used to teach, including \$3000 awarded to four students this year.

Palliative Care

Tim Hageman introduced Dr. Glen Komatsu from Little Company of Mary (where both Jim Hunter and President Shannon are on the Board). Glen has both a neo-natology fellowship and an adult palliative care fellowship, and he focused on the latter of these. He told us, "We help people with their physical, spiritual, emotional and existential suffering." As much tragedy as he sees, he nonetheless said his work brings him joy through observing the strength and resilience of the human spirit. In palliative care, finding joy brings happiness which promotes success, and joy comes from within, where peace, kindness and generosity are found. He told us stories and then led us in the reading of "The Gift of the Ladybug," in which horses, feeling sad about the limitations of ladybugs, learn that ladybugs are meant to be ladybugs, not horses.

Dr. Komatsu pulled no punches in describing his work. The 6-year-old boy who loved "The Gift of the Ladybug" died, as did his brother from the same awful disease, and their parents live on to endure the unbearable pain of this loss. Dr. Komatsu looks to have found a path toward learning the relationship between pain and joy. Some of us may have a long way to go before even stepping foot on that path, much less walking on it, but his focus on peace, kindness and generosity surely shone some light on the "existential" darkness of loss. Peace, kindness and generosity sure sound a lot like Rotary ideas, so it just might be that the spirit of Celebrate Manhattan Beach, and all the good works it will fund, can help light the way.
