

Dede, in a bright red dress and big earrings, brightened our day, as she told us of the activities of the Volunteer Center of the South Bay-Harbor-Long Beach. With its five offices, in 2008 they served 35,619 clients and

some 600 non-profits. Their budget is \$1.3 million, and with the additional \$1 milion of "in-kind donations" the Volunteer Center contributes more than \$17 million to the community each year.

Last year at Christmas, their "adopt a family" program provided 1,520 families food, clothing and toys for the holidays. Operation "Teddy Bear" filled 5,600 backpacks with school supplies for distribution via 45 schools in disadvantaged areas.

In addition the Volunteer Center

- Refers volunteers to 600+ nonprofits in 43 cities in the South Bay.
- Provides a Court referral Community Service.
- Seminars For non Profits
- Provides a 600+ Library of videos, training manuals for the non profit sector.

FORMER LONG-TIME ROTARIAN LT. COLONEL FRANCIS DAVID "CISCO" RUTH (RET.), 88, passed away May 20, 2009 at his home in Air Force Village West in Riverside, Calif. Born June 7, 1920 and raised in Bowling Green, Ohio, he graduated from Bowling Green State University in 1942 with a degree in Political Science. Joining the Army after graduation, he completed officer training and in 1945, graduated from the Command and General Staff School. While serving in San Francisco, he was given the nickname "Cisco", which stuck with him throughout his life. In his Army career, Cisco served in both Command and Staff assignments and was awarded 11 service ribbons and medals including the Bronze Star.

In 1947, he was the Chief Security Officer for the Foreign Exchange Deposi-

tory, Office of Military Government, Germany. In this position he was responsible for the safeguarding of more than \$550 million in valuables confiscated by Germany during World War II, until the rightful owners were determined and the valuables returned. He also served as the Chief Security Officer for top secret operation 'Birddog' that brought 11 trainloads of Deutschmarks into Germany to replace the highly inflated Reichmarks. This was recognized as the single most significant action that stabilized the German economy after WWII, and precipitated Russia's blockade of Berlin. Cisco received the Army Commendation Medal for his part in the operation. In 1949, he served as Operations Officer, Labor Service Headquarters where he planned and organized Labor Service Companies from displaced persons to load aircraft for the Berlin Airlift. Later, during the War in Korea, Cisco served as a General Staff Officer and Liaison Officer with the Nationalist Government, Republic of China, to negotiate and arrange the prisoner of war exchange. For this work he received the Bronze Star.

In 1962, after 20 years of service, Cisco retired from the Army as a Lt. Colonel. Cisco and his famiy moved to California where he began a second career with Aerospace Corporation, working in administrative and management positions until retiring in 1986. While working for Aerospace, he was Chairman of the Credit Union Committee for 11 years.

While in California, he served his community, beginning with his efforts to form the Palos Verdes Peninsula Advisor Council of 43 homeowners associations in 1965. This organization was the forerunner of the Save Our Coastline movement, which led to the incorporation of the city of Rancho Palos Verdes in 1973. Cisco was elected to the first two terms of office on the RPV City Council. During this time, he served as the Mayor Pro Temp for Rancho Palos Verdes. In 1979, he earned a Masters Degree in Public Administration from Cal. State University, Dominguez Hills.

Cisco was not only a patriot and civic minded, he was a kind and gentle man with a wonderful sense of humor. He will be greatly missed by his family and friends.

His survivors include his beloved wife of 65 years, Pat; their three children, Bill Ruth and spouse Cindy, Pamela Terry and spouse Ron, and Debi Parker and spouse Milton, five grandchildren; Angela Silvers, Matthew Terry, Kristen Ruth, Daniel Parker and Elizabeth Parker; and two great-grandchildren, Brody and Brock Silvers, as well as his brother Bill Ruth of Holly, Michigan, and nieces and nephews.

Memorial services were held at the Riverside National Cemetery, Thursday May 28, 2009, followed by a chapel service at Air Force Village West and a reception at the chapel fellowship hall.
