Don is president of the docent group; Sabrina is a junior docent, one of four high school student-docents sponsored by our club.

Don had us diving, spouting, and eating just like the biggest creatures on

Earth—blue whales. And he and Sabrina had a PowerPoint presentation that showcased the Interpretive Center's building, breathtaking site, museum displays of the natural and cultural history of the Palos Verdes Peninsula, and the migrating gray whales that can be easily viewed from the Center's outstandig vantage point.

If you want to know more about the Peninsula, the Interpretive Center is the place to start and return to repeatedly. The displays are educational and the docents are eager to share their knowledge of the area's geology, history, and marine mammals; they lead hikes, too, notably at the Forrestal Nature Preserve and Abalone Cove tide pools.
