Terri exemplifies the kind of intelligent, perceptive and responsive professional that the Lowe Destination Development Group has selected for their leadership team. She reeled off the resort stars she and they have attracted to work here, and it was impressive, like her. She was emphatic about her interest in the community and in using local vendors and local artwork throughout the resort. Terri talked about the 582 rooms, suites, casitas, villas and bungalows. She talked about the 60,000 square feet of meeting space, the 25,000 square foot oceanfront spa, the three swimming pools, the nine hole golf course, the incredible array of dining experiences and the secluded coves for snorkeling and kayaking. They even have a yoga and palates facility. They have public ocean trails adjacent to their facilities where joggers and trail people are welcome, even dogs. They have concessions on the trails. Wow. Many of their venues are open to the public, with varying charges, of course. They even have a special newcomer rate and a special TerreNeighbor rate, for neighbors. That would be you and me. The list of restaurants was exciting: the Mar'sel, Nelson's, Catalina Kitchen, The Grill, Vista Lounge, the Spa Café, The Coffee Shop and the Pacifica Pool bar. They have a special program for children. Did I mention the golf course? And what about the tax revenue for RPV, and the hundreds of jobs that have been created.

The Lowe Group is the fourth largest independent hotel operator in the United States. They open Terrenea in 80 days. For 33 years we had Marineland, and then for the next 20 years we had a site waiting to be developed. Now in 80 days, we have a world-class resort right in our own community. Terri impressed the club members with her professionalism, her interest in our needs and in our community. The room names at the resort were recommended by locals and include such references as Marineland, Catalina, Pointe Vicente, Rocky Point, Inspiration Point, White's Point, Crystal Cove, Golden Cove, Abalone Cove and so on. Her hospitality and excitement rubbed off on everyone. I am right now making my reservation for the June opening and that Pacific Terrenea experience.

Bruce Attig concluded the meeting with a shipwreck story. As I left the meeting, I overheard limping Rotarian **John LaBella** inquiring about the physical therapy services at Terrenea.
