

Do not worry folks. Everything is fine. Captain Stoll was back to present part 2. To refresh the memory of our dementia members, Captain Stoll was a career Navy intelligence officer who served our country for 30 years.

This week he was kind enough to bring a ceremonial sword that we were able to pass around the room without a single injury. He offered his personal opinion on water boarding that is shared by this writer. The Geneva Convention means nothing to our terrorist enemies today. They would just as soon behead you as look at you. It is the duty of our DOD intelligence community to gather intelligence. Water boarding is a means to an end. No one has ever been killed using this process.

He further discussed how all Russian subs are tracked using accoustical sonar buoys to gather accoustical data. Each sub has its own accoustical "fingerprint". He shared a story from his career of how these buoys are deployed and how some of the buoys were recovered by native Hawaiians just outside the international three-mile limit of the islands.

He described the process on how "on-the-ground" human intelligence is obtained, and how painstaking the process is to capture the appropriate information to protect and secure our country.
