us that it's what inside the box that counts. Maxine, a 24-year veteran of the business world and financial industry, spent 15 years at the Chicago Board of Trade, building a strong foundation of business expertise. She is also a regular commentator on NPR's "Marketplace Morning Report." Inside the Box training focuses on innovation and creativity, team building, communication skills and sales training. Maxine started off the program by asking us to find a partner—someone who had the same thumb size! After finding our partner we sat down and faced each other. We were asked to take turns telling our partner the history of our name (origin, nicknames, etc.). Maxine then asked how we felt listening to our partner's one-minute story. Most felt entrusted, empowered, interested, involved and more informed about their partner. Sharing a little bit of yourself makes others feel privileged and entrusted. This is exactly how we want our clients to feel. Maxine then shared with us the Components of Authenticity. The first component is to "Quit trying to be clever, be obvious". If you do this, it will allow others to do the same. The second component is "Acceptance". Accepting the offers given to us. Validating what others say.

To end the program Maxine called up five members of the club. She asked the members to plan a barbecue and were instructed to say only, "yes, but...". Statements starting with "yes, but..." were interpreted as very negative. Maxine then instructed the group to say only, "yes, and..." and to plan the same barbecue. The outcome was much more positive and energetic. Maxine finished with reminding us that this more positive, "Yes, and..." approach will change your life! Try it. •
