Unified School District Board, Gabriella Holt. Ms. Holt is also the Republican candidate for the 54th Assembly District.

Gabriella began her speech by revealing to us that "running for a State office has been quite a journey" and that through the experience she has gained far greater insight into the process of re-districting and Proposition 11. She explained that redistricting is not a juicy tinsel for the press and therefore very few people are aware of the issue and to many it's the same as gerrymandering. Not true, we learned! Re-districting occurs every 10 years after the census is completed; ideally, it is based on the population, however, in reality it is based on partisanship.

(Incidentally, she explained, in 1812 Governor Alfred Gerry allowed for redrawing an ally's district in the



shape of a salamander— thus "gerrymandering"). Ms. Holt sadly explained in the last statewide election only 1 of 450 state seats resulted in a shift of parties. She advocated the passage of Proposition 11, which calls for a non-partisan commission to draw the boundaries in the State of California; only then will we eliminate the partisan politics geared to maintaining the status quo.

Ms. Holt then opened the floor to questions and offered her personal opinions on subjects ranging from the State budget crisis, the growth of voters not registered to the two main parties, to Nicole Parra, Assemblywoman in central California.

President Bruce thanked Gabriella on behalf of Palos Verdes Peninsula Rotary for addressing us at lunch and presented her with a memento of the occasion.
