

Subsequently, Ninon relocated to Los Angeles, married, and worked in advertising.

In 1996 Ninon founded "Kids Talk," a nationally and internationally known organization that produces "Voices of Tomorrow," an award-winning television show that features working with kids in gangs. Some 18,000 Los Angeles teens are homeless and live within the gang culture, where the only way to leave a gang is to die.

Working with young people, Ninon encourages them to seek their dreams and go for them. For women, she believes that is not hard to do. Just do what you want to do! Nothing can stop you but yourself!
