

also reminded us about our goal to raise \$1,000.for Polio Plus. We are, as of our meeting last Friday, at \$240 in our journey to reach this goal. **John** also informed us about the cost of Concourse d'Elegance tickets at \$25 each; group rate is \$20 each, and since we paid \$12.50 apiece for them we will make a profit of \$7.50 for each ticket we sell. **John** says we still need volunteers for parking duty.

Our speaker was Ted Vegvari. Ted and his assistant projector operator, Dale Allen, were introduced by John McTaggart, a former member of our club, and a past president of the Sunset Rotary Club. As most of us know John was been a member of the Rancho Palos Verdes City Council for many years.

Ted is the founder of PV on the NET. Ted established a symbiotic relationship with RPV back in 1995. He was in need of a location for his budding computer-learning center, and the city was in need of his expertise regarding web development and other digital services. Out of this merging of talent and needs has blossomed a non-profit organization dedicated to advancing the educational needs of young and old alike, while at the same time providing digital and multimedia solutions to government, organizations, clubs, and many community-based entities.

The following highlight some of these accomplishments:

- Developed the first websites for all four cities on the peninsula.
- Established the first Computer Technical Center.
- Built and installed the first networks for R.H.E. and R.P.V.
- Set up the first TV Channel and Studio on the grounds of R.P.V. City Hall.
- Set up the first computer internships.
- The first G.I.S. (Geographic Information Systems) center.
- First computer animation competition.
- First website for seniors.
- First computer training for city staff.
- First websites for Rotary Clubs, the P.V. Chamber of Commerce, local cities, non-profit organizations, clubs and groups.

• First to offer free multimedia services to candidates for city office.

Ted told us of some of the success stories involving students who have been involved in the programs he started. One of the kids who started at the center went on to post a short on U-tube called "Doll Face." This was the most-viewed selection on U-tube a couple of years ago. Another young man has gone on to success and a six- figure income working for MTV.

Taking advantage of the G.I.S. capabilities under his control, Ted set up a program called "Map Your Neighborhood." The purpose of this program is to co-ordinate city emergency services.

He has also put into the hands of some very capable students a project to develop safe bike routes here on the Peninsula. In a similar fashion he has overseen the production of a map highlighting the horse trails meandering around the beautiful Palos Verdes Peninsula.

Asked by a guest how many Mac computers he had at the center he replied, "One, and it is not turned on." Yeh...go PC. •


Although the structure of the Concours Board of Directors has gone through reorganization over the years, we have always strived to keep a balance of representation for both our Rotary Club and the Art Center.
