THREE LOCAL SOUTH BAY ROTARY SERVICE CLUBS JOIN TOGETHER TO BRING THE DICTIONARY PROJECT TO TORRANCE UNIFIED STUDENTS

TORRANCE, CA – Starting this week, local Rotarians will deliver the gift of a brand-new dictionary to every Torrance Unified School District third-grade student. The project is led by the **Rotary Club of South Bay Sunrise** (24335) and sponsored as a joint effort between two additional local Rotary Clubs: **Rotary Club of Torrance Del Amo** (762) and **Rotary Club of West Torrance** (746) and distributed through the Dictionary Project, a nationwide nonprofit who has assisted in the distribution of **37,104,245** dictionaries since the project began.

In the age of AI, automatic spellcheck, and Google, the dictionary might seem like a relic of the past; however, as the champions of our recent Elementary Spelling Bee can attest, knowing how to use a dictionary properly is still a key literacy foundation. The gifted dictionaries will help students equitably learn a myriad of skills, including how to spell correctly, discover new words, read through multiple meanings for each word, and practice the proper pronunciation of words.

Rotarians believe in the magic that comes from a student having the ability to flip through and explore a physical book, where they can serendipitously discover words that they may not have thought to look up on Google and don't have to worry about encountering any words or definitions that are not appropriate for children.

"We are very pleased to be able to offer this gift and deliver the dictionaries in person to all 17 elementary schools. Our club members feel the project's mission is aligned closely with our desire to encourage students to become good writers, active readers, creative thinkers, and resourceful learners," explains **Rotary Club of South Bay Sunrise President, Pat Sandt**.
