Today's program was put on by the Mammoth Mountain Community Foundation (MMCF). In contrast to the Mammoth Lakes Foundation that supports the arts, MMCF supports K-12 education athletics including the Mammoth Mountain (MM) ski and snowboard teams and MUSD's school PE program.

Formed in 2009-10, MMCF brings a significant amount of money into the schools to support winter sports. They sponsor a center for excellence to support young athletes. Their biggest fundraiser is the Mammoth Invitational. Next year it will be held from April 11th through the 14th and will feature coaches from the U.S. Ski team and Olympic snowboarders. Last year MMCF netted \$300,000. Part of their money comes from a \$1 donation from MM for each night's lodging at various MM-owned hotels, condos and other rental properties. Money from each ski ticket sold and \$1000 from each Black Pass are also funneled to MMCF.

MMCF sponsors an independent learning center for Olympic-class athletes where they can study and either board or ski. This is free for Mammoth locals, but the learning center charges tuition for out-of-area youth. MMCF is in the process of moving into the newly renovated Slopeside Center
