He reminded the club of his beginnings with the Town of Mammoth Lakes as Parks and Recreation Director (he was originally hired to look into building a recreation center, but soon found that there was no money). He then talked about his transition to Mono County and the challenges of managing a geographically large area with the wide diversity of services that counties must provide. When he was approached by the Town Council to replace outgoing manager Rob Clark, he jumped at the opportunity to come back to serve the community he lives in. On the airport settlement, he described the process to date and outlined some of the difficulties for the Town that will likely result from having to pay off the judgment. The program was a great reintroduction to Dave and we are happy to have him back.
