Roz Dubrow told us about a The Bridge Initiative, a project a friend of her granddaughter's is involved in. Thanks to funding in part from Rotary, the youth of Kenya are being taught bio-intensive organic gardening of indigenous crops, performing arts and life skills while also being funded for a year of school, which is just \$50! Volunteers live as guests in the village where they teach. In addition, some help build wells for clean water - one well provides water for 1,700 villagers. Speaker: Melanie Bickelman, Newborns in Need

A registered nurse for 12 years, including a time in pediatrics, Melanie stayed home to raise her two daughters and then started looking for a non-profit idea when they reached their teens. While she considered starting her own organization, she was captivated when she learned of Newborns in Need. The organization started in North Carolina in 1992 to provide basic supplies to infants whose parents could ill afford them. Being fairly new, there are still not many chapters, and Melanie decided to start the third California one here in the San Fernando Valley.

Strictly a volunteer-run organization, they collect and distribute formula, diapers, afghans, clothing, toys, books and toiletries to hospitals and clinics for families in need. This is often those whose infants are born premature, as 450,000 are each year. Or some of the 12,000 infants born each year to single parents, or the 2,500 every day born in poverty, a growing problem. Families make up 40% of the homeless in LA County now.

Melanie concentrates on donations to shelters, including those for battered women. At the holidays she gave 15 huge bags of supplies to LA Family Housing, another organization helping the homeless. The shelter they provide is in such demand that each family, no matter how large, gets only a single room. And since donations are down, she is working closely with them to find new ways or sources to meet the supply needs of their tenants.

With her chapter less than a year old, Melanie is also looking for information and resources of her own that can help her meet those goals, from ways to raise money to places she can put a collection box, such as churches. She gave us some creative ways we or others can help, including holding a baby shower or craft meeting where people donate or make needed items. Most needed are diapers, formula and baby wipes. For her speaker gift, we gave Melanie one of the beautiful baby afghans and matching hats made by Roz's friend Sara Miller and collected through Rotary Knitting Communities Together, plus an infant-safe stuffed animal.
