Speaker: Clinton Jones, DC

What do you do after you retire as a professional football player? For Clinton Jones, the choice was easy. He wanted to do something to help those in need, whether that need was spiritual or physical in nature.

Over the years he has devoted himself to a life of service, combining his adherence to Soka Gakkai International, a lay Buddhist organization, whose members strive to live with confidence, create value and contribute to the well-being of friends, family and the community, with his Chiropractic work. Chiropractic, he explains, is more than adjusting the spine or cracking the neck. It's about realizing that the central nervous system is the switchboard of our life and when we can program it properly, we can heal ourselves. "It is the key to human evolution," Clinton said. "Nothing changes until we change ourselves. Our environment is just a reflection of ourselves. Every day we have to find a way to improve the quality of life. Essentially, everyone wants to be happy. I commend you all on your global consciousness. The world is one family. Our diversity gives us our strength."

He noted that he particularly liked the Rotary motto "Service Above Self", as he felt that was always present in this life. "We each have unique abilities and attributes. We were all born to create value and contribute to the world. In Rotary you promote goodwill and friendships, and by doing this you create value."

Dr. Rosielee Jones reflected that their daughter was involved in the track meet put on by the Van Nuys Rotary club every year and she always wanted to thank the Rotarians, as the event it meant so much to their daughter. Luckily Jim Tenner, from the Van Nuys club, was at our meeting that day, so she got her chance. Said Clinton, "It's so important to support youth. When you devote yourself to helping young people, you keep your own youthfulness alive." He ended by stating there are three treasures in life: Your income, your body (wellbeing) and your heart." If you have these things, you have everything," he said.
