If you haven't signed up for the **District Conference**, June 8 and 9 yet, do it now. This will be the final time 5260 will get together as a District. The event, to be held at the Beverly Garland Hotel, 4222 Vineland Ave., North Hollywood, will begin Friday night with a dinner honoring

all the PDGs and outgoing presidents. Paul Netzel, Past RI Director, will speak Saturday morning at 9:00 a.m. Conference cost is \$155, including all meals (registration is just \$20 of that). Speaker: Jose Nolasco, LaunchPad

Robin introduced Jose Nolasco, our speaker, who is the Program Coördinator of LaunchPad, a relatively new organization in Van Nuys helping students succeed in school. Jose started by telling us that "it goes without saying in this group that it's what we do for others that matter in this world."

With four children of his own, ranging from 18 down to 4 years of age, Jose is very child oriented; he loves family and kids. That's part of what led him to LaunchPad, which helps students with academic tutoring while also providing physical activities, like basketball, music, arts programs and lots of caring adults to listen to whatever the students feel a need to talk about.

Before joining LaunchPad, Jose worked almost 12 years for Children's Hunger Fund in Africa, Russia and South America. He noted that there was always a lot of bustling going on in the cities, with people going in and out, but few stopped to help those who needed it. He himself grew up in Pacoima, an area, as he said, rather light in country clubs, and where the biggest limo was the RTD bus, but with strong family and community ties.

One of the key goals for LaunchPad is to "Build brighter futures for children." He told us about Adall, who is a great example of the kind of impact they can make. Adall is 15, already 6"1" tall, with a wonderfully engaging smile, who is earning A's and B's in school. But when he first came to LaunchPad for tutoring help two years ago it was a very different story, with his grades in the C's and D's showing he really needed help. Now when he comes to their after school program his homework is usually already done, and he can grow in lots of new areas.

Both the student interns and adult mentors really connect with the kids, helping them develop in areas as diverse as artistic expression and good manners. Jose said they find that often bad behavior is due to a lack of knowing any other way to behave, so their mentors help them learn what is socially acceptable. With people who "pour care" into them, the children blossom.

While many of the children have parents who are not involved in their education, in other cases the parents have reached the limit of their knowledge or time, especially when students start needing help with higher math and science. The Kahn Academy has been especially helpful in the math area, training the tutors how to teach the subject well.

When parents are involved, the program finds that kids start to connect more with them, opening up and sharing more of what is going on in their lives, such as one girl Jose mentioned who started to tell her dad about drug use at school, giving him a chance to teach her how to avoid difficult situations that could ensue.

LaunchPad has really coalesced in the last two years from groups of services offered at Church on the Way in Van Nuys (at Kester and Sherman Way). They have a

new Director, and, in Jose, a Program Coördinator now. They are still looking for more tutors, especially in math and science. From 26-40 students are in the tutoring program, and another 50-100 in the church mentoring program. Funding comes in part from a federal grant that extends into next year, but that covers only some of their expenses. Jose teased that if any of us know a millionaire looking for someone to give a briefcase full of money to, they'd gladly help!

For now they are doing a lot of good things with the money they do have, including recently buying 10 iMacs for a computer lab to teach high schoolers internet skills in the fall. Families do contribute a little: \$25/family with one or more children in the program. In addition to tutoring in a wide range of academic subjects, art, music and sports, the students receive T-shirts and notebooks.

Barbara gave Jose a 4 Way Test coin, certificate of appreciation and Rotary information, and then Don presented him with a book for Casa Esperanza and its bookplate to sign.
