Speaker – 4-Way Test Essay Awards, Sepulveda M.S.

Sara credited the late John Alexander for our sponsoring the 4 Way Test essay contest held at Sepulveda Middle School, as well as Monroe High School this year. It became a major part of Rotary just 10 years after it was first written exactly 80 years ago. As the code of conduct Rotarians have used to guide our behavior for 70 years, we know it is also an excellent standard for young adults to learn and follow. As she introduced each student, Sara told us something about each of them and what impact the test has had.

Helen Ruiz was our first place winner. An eighth grader, Helen's essay showed a maturity far beyond her years. She gave examples of using the test with her younger sister to fairly allocate time on their shared computer, and when taking tests in school. She explained that, "When I am taking a test I don't cheat. That way I am being truthful to myself and fair to the person next to me. If someone in the class needs help on a problem, I will gladly help the. Then we build a better relationship, and if I need help on a problem they will help me too, so being helpful will actually be beneficial to all the people involved.

"The point is I have realized that using truth, using fairness, building better friendships and being beneficial, is very useful in one's life. It is the way all things should be done. In my opinion, the 4 Way Test is an excellent set of criteria that should be known to more people because that will help make a better, kinder society. The Four Way Test can help make a difference in not just your life, but the people around you, too."

Our second place winner was José Morales, another eighth grader. He read his essay, in which he admitted he had been lying to his teachers about his homework, but found the story of Herbert Taylor and the 4 Way Test so compelling he started telling his teachers the truth, and taking the consequences. He sees the test as a tool which will help him succeed in school and in life, as he prepares for college and a medical career.

Seventh grader Quamar Hall was our third place winner. He explained how the 4 Way Test elements are all interlinked, and when applied, create strong friendships. He uses it in his life more and more. He concluded his essay with, "By following it you can even develop a life of high moral values and good character. The 4 Way Test helps me in my life and I hope to be a Rotarian one day." Another big round of applause!
