Mid SFV Members Discuss Rotary

Mid SFV members shared how they were introduced to Rotary and how long they've been a member.

John Alexander, who – hold to your hats – has been a Rotary member for 43 years, was District Governor from 1975 to 1976. **Barbara Pampalone,** our incoming president, who has been in Rotary for 13 years, joined in large part because of her husband Joseph's involvement during the previous 30 years.

Renie D'Auria, one of our newer members, was brought into the club and the organization by Barbara. Renie is the executive director of FISH, a North Valley-based food bank.

Roz Dubrow was a patient of Barbara's at her dental office. A volunteer with other groups for years, Roz was inspired by what our Rotary club was doing and wanted to be a part of it. Roz has kept our Rotary Knitting Communities project going at top speed.

Frank Santucci was invited by fellow club member Marc Tapper. Frank said he loves being in Rotary and loves handling the money. Frank's diversified career includes financial planner, photographer and audio equipment salesperson.

Robin Kellogg was introduced to Rotary by Barbara Pampalone three years ago. At the time, she and Barbara belonged to LeTip, a networking group.

Beth Ullman joined Rotary 18 years ago...she must have been just a tot. She was introduced to the group by her chiropractor. Beth has changed her industry category four times over the years to include Internet startups, computers, non-profit and jewelry making.

Marc Tapper was playing golf with friend Sheri Polak some 20 years ago when she asked him why he wasn't in Rotary. He replied, "What's Rotary?" He was at a Rotary breakfast the following week.
