## No Speaker – Club Assembly

## Budget

PDG Emilio again went over the proposed budget for next year if all three clubs merge. To keep dues down to \$200 per person for the year and still do all the projects that were the most popular, \$17,000 would need to be raised. Some of that could come from the two existing club foundations. While projects should be independently supported, the budget does include \$3,600 for the Van Nuys track meet. PDG Les said their club's reverse raffle has raised \$10,000 in the past, with half of that going to the Union Local 300 Scholarship Fund, in part because of their help in raising the money through their 28,000 members.

In discussion of recognition events, both the number of the events (currently Van Nuys does at least 3/month and often more for Tierra del Sol or New Horizons) and the dollar amounts given were discussed. One point was to open the recognition to other worthy groups or to do fewer so there could be more opportunities to do other things as meetings. It might also be necessary to reduce the number to keep the meetings a more reasonable length. Jim Tenner, President-Elect, plans to start meetings promptly at noon and end them at 1:15 p.m.

Les also reported that the NSFV foundation can be used for recognition and other projects; the VN foundation has several restrictions in that regard. Currently the VN foundation has approximately \$126,000 and their general fund \$28,000.

There was additional discussion of fundraisers, events at meetings and the time frames involved in those.

Rich explained the desire to get and keep new members with reasonable dues, which Martha echoed. He said the venue committee is still looking for a new location that could hold a large group and offer a good menu. Martha asked what the geographic boundaries are and we learned some members come from as far away as Valencia and North Hollywood, in addition to Chatsworth and Woodland Hills in our group.

Les reviewed the list of **proposed club officers** with the assembly, which includes Jim as President, Robin as Secretary, Razi as Treasurer, Rich as Director of Membership, Emilio as Director of Administration, Frank as Club Service Chair, Marina Martinez as Hospitality Chair, Carlos and Zoraida as International Co-chairs, Lisa and Marie as Community Co-chairs, Rosielee and Mauricio as New Generations Co-chairs, Les as Foundation and Projects Director, Raul as PR Director and Tom as Housing Chair. There were a few others added during the meeting, but not announced. We will need a presidentelect by about October.

Marie and Beth shared the idea that whether we end up one, two or three clubs, we look forward to sharing projects and focusing on Service Above Self.

#### **Proposed Merged Club Name**

While we did not have time to vote on it because we opted to extend the discussion of other items, we did learn the name committee proposes The Rotary Club of Van Nuys San Fernando Valley be the name of the merged club.

The District Conference (June 8 and 9) was a wonderful, emotional and fellowship-filled event.
