The Audubon Society and Rotary have several things in common. Both were started in 1905 to improve conditions---one for the improvement of mankind and one for the preservation of birds. Two noble causes born that same year. And both are still around after 105 years.

The Audubon Society has 500 chapters in the U.S. with five to six within LA County. All are independent organizations with their own 501(c)(3)s.

Dave, a former IT professional for IBM, found the Audubon Society by chance. After reading an article in the Los Angeles Times several years ago about an oil spill in San Pedro and how it affected the avian population there, he volunteered to help clean the oil off birds. One thing led to another and now he is talking about Audubon whenever and wherever he can.

"Once you get involved with birds, you get involved with Audubon," said Dave.

What does Audubon do within the community? Here are some of their projects:

- Bird walks around the Sepulveda Basin are offered the first Sunday of each month. According to Weeshoff, you can see an average of 40 to 50 species in just a two-hour period.
- Free assessment of current plants and landscaping for homeowners, and recommendations of the native plants they could replace it with.
- Providing information in classroom settings, at local volunteer, business and civic organizations
- Through its Sepulveda Basin Environmental Education Program, the society helps teacher organize school field trips, so children can explore the birds, microorganisms and insects that reside there.

In addition, the Audubon Society keeps tabs on local projects such as the remediation effort at Chatsworth Reservoir, the Santa Susana Field Laboratory cleanup, the Malibu Lagoon and Hansen Dam, offering their expertise on how certain changes may affect the ecosystem to minimize those with adverse effects.

Now let's see if you paid attention when Dave was telling us the difference between a bird watcher, birder and ornithologist. For those who have forgotten: bird watchers are out in nature looking at birds, Birders know many of the types of birds and keep lists of the birds they've identified, and ornithologists study birds and their migratory behavior. You all get an A+. Happy Bird Watching.
