SPEAKER:

District Gov. Nominee D. J. Sun explained that our district now has 64 clubs and is part of Zone 26. International President Ron Burton's theme is: "Engage Rotary, Change Lives." Past RI President D. K. Lee is the Foundation Trustee and the goals this year are to (1) Eradicate polio (2) Get members to "own" the Foundation (3) Launch the new grants process through Future Vision with minimum grants now to be \$30,000 and (4) to engage Rotarians in innovative projects and partnerships.

Rotarians are to work on Strategic Planning. Future Vision is to simplify the grants by making the districts more responsible in 6 Focus areas. They are (1) Peace, (2) Education (3) Disease control and Health (4) Maternal and child care (5) Water and Sanitation and (6) Economic and Community Development. The district is preparing a big Future Vision Project. Patterning with Home Boy Project, with funds from clubs, our district, a district in Korea, and matched by Rotary International a baking Machine is being purchased for \$59,000.00 to improve the services of the Home Boy Project.

Last year the project, "South Park Renewal" was done also with Reverse Matching funds from a Korean club and district, and matched by RI. Also the City of Los Angeles, simulated by what Rotary was doing, dedicated and additional \$35,000.00 to the renovation of the city park. We saw a video of work on the baseball diamonds and sanding and painting of the bleachers and even the curbs. The preschool cubbies were repainted as well as at least parts of the building and clean-up (not shown of the kitchen and rooms inside was done by a quantity of volunteers from the district. It was inspiring to see so many Rotarians at work – Eli got stuck in the heat of the baseball field, but Barbara didn't. (We both encourage other Rotarians next year to participate in these very well-organized work days.) Mike gave out a map for parking on Saturday and assignments of hours to work at the food booth at the airport. Over 700 people are scheduled to come for tours, and more are expected. This is our first big fun fund raiser of the year as we celebrate with the airport the widening of one of the runways.
