

#### Afghanistan Dental Clinic Fundraiser

The Evening in Kabul dinner fundraiser for the Afghan Dental Relief Project held this past Saturday was a big success, raising over \$7,000! Barbara thanked everyone for their help and participation, whether by attending, donating an auction item or helping at the event. She reported that it was the most successful fundraiser for Dr. Rolfe and the clinic yet held, plus he made a lot of good contacts for the future. Jim added that Dr. Rolfe has not only accomplished an amazing feat with the clinic, over the years he has put in everything he had — over \$1 million. The clinic serves women and children only because in Afghanistan they cannot go to the same clinic as men do, but that also creates jobs for women and orphans who would otherwise be at the mercy of local chieftains or distant male relatives.

To further help Dr. Rolfe, Barbara nominated him to be one of CNN's Heroes for 2013. There may be a monetary prize, but the publicity would also help him support the clinic.

# **Speaker: Anthony Marks, Illegal Drug Issues**

Mauricio introduced our speaker, whom he met through his wife's involvement in an LAPD program for high school students. Anthony has a broad background (18 years) in law enforcement (he's a DRE, drug recognition expert) and the pharmaceutical industry (25 years) in addition to his Master's degree in Psychology, the combination of which makes him rather uniquely qualified to understand and address the issues of drug use by our young people.

Anthony asked us the definition of a drug, getting a variety of answers from us, with most of us agreeing that nicotine and caffeine should be included. He then gave us law enforcement's definition: any substance, natural or synthetic, which can impair performance. While there are a few who get too aggressive on caffeine, by the legal definition neither caffeine or nicotine are drugs. But some things you might not have thought of that way are, such as Dust-Off, a computer cleaning spray, that gives a short high when inhaled ("huffed"), in part by displacing oxygen; it also significantly damages the lungs.

There are 7 legal categories of drugs, and when citing someone for driving or being under the influence, officers must specify which category is involved. They include opiates, inhalants, hallucinogens, stimulants, dissociative anesthetics, alcohol and prescription medicines that can impair function. (The Controlled Substances Act (CSA) regulates five classes of drugs: narcotics, depressants, stimulants, hallucinogens, and anabolic steroids, the last of which is not considered an impairment drug.)

We were stunned by the drug paraphernalia Anthony

showed us, from meth pipes to apples with holes in which to smoke marijuana to aluminum foil with burn marks, the remnants of an Oxycontin tablet lit on fire so that the fumes can be inhaled. This technique is also used to smoke heroin. Teens often refer to it as "chasing the dragon". We were also shown hollowed out industrial bolts and black bottle caps topped with magnets for hiding their "stash". He pointed out the easiest place to hide a drug needle is with other needles. And empty prescription bottles make an innocuous looking container for illegal pills. One reason that labels now describe the pill being dispensed, including its markings.

Anthony works only from scholarly, scientific sources for his information in preparing his material. He avoids the polarizing propaganda. When giving talks, his goal is not to demonize or whitewash drugs, but to help people understand the truth about various drugs. Many drugs do have legitimate uses, but caution needs to be exercised when operating machinery, for example. Other drugs seem to have no redeeming virtues, like the bath salts that have recently been banned in California. Those are an MDPV (methylenedioxypyrovalerone) compound that is smoked or snorted. It acts like a form of "super speed" and causes hallucinations, high blood pressure, pupil dilation, elevated heart rate and violent behavior – such as the cannibalism in Florida.

One interesting bit of information he shared was about the "contact high" people talk about getting when around marijuana smokers. He believes some of that is just a placebo effect, but studies done in a closed vehicle show that there are some minute traces of marijuana in the saliva of the non-smokers, but no evidence in their urine, while the smokers had an abundance of evidence in both.




