

Mauricio Aranda introduced our program, now 12 years old, to recognize people working to improve themselves who normally would not be in the public eye. Today we honored Jackeline Giron and Danielle Ortega from Tierra Del Sol. Kevin Luperchio told us his job is to help people at Tierra del Sol get jobs, through the Nexus program, and Jackeline is excelling at that. She is in a college program, did a 16 month internship and volunteers at Olive View Hospital.

Frena Harris presented Danielle Ortega, explaining that her job is to help Danielle get to the point Jackeline has already reached. Frena works at the Sunland campus and shared what Danielle does there. She started as a teacher's assistant but showed particular care with the linens, so she got a job at the La Cañada-Flintridge YMCA in charge of their towels, folding and stacking 1500 a week with military precision. Both honorees are making wonderful progress in both their jobs and communities.


