

### Track Meet

Don Reinken suggested we consider putting PolioPlus information and money collection points at our up-coming track meet, at the registration and refreshment tables. This meet is a great way to remind people this disease still prevents many young people from even walking, must less competing in track events. The idea got an almost unanimous endorsement from the group. Ken and Robin volunteered to co-chair this aspect of the event. Please give them and Don any help you can.

### SPECIAL RECOGNITION:

Mauricio introduced our program for outstanding students in the Birmingham Charter H.S. track program, and Coach Scott King. Scott told us the two students being recognized today are actually at the Daniel Pearl Journalism Magnet next to Birmingham, but still are part of the regular school's P.E. program. Both of their families are very involved and help cheer the kids on.

(This magnet program separated from Birmingham when the latter went charter. It is named in honor of Wall Street Journalist Daniel Pearl, who was a graduate of Birmingham H.S., and murdered by terrorists in Pakistan February 1, 2002.

Scott predicted senior Louis Solano will be in the Hall of Fame. He just got a full tuition scholarship to Syracuse University – sparking cries from the floor of "Do you know how *cold* it gets there?!" The foundation giving the scholarship had over 2500 applicants; Louis was one of only 10 recipients. That honor was only in part due to his skill on the field – his 4+ GPA helped. He'll be studying mechanical engineering, and eventually the foundation will help him find both internships and a full-time job.

Vanessa Brahas also has impressive scholarship credentials, with a 3.8 GPA now in the middle of her sophomore year, She told us how much she appreciates the chance to participate in sports, and that she plans to attend UCLA, specializing in pediatric medicine.

### SPEAKER: Wynne Ritch, Boy Scouts of America

Newest member Wynne Ritch retired from the Boy Scouts of America (BSA) last year after 40 years of service, having started with them in 1972. But as he explained, he *really* started with them in 1952 – as a cub scout. He went on to become an eagle scout, earning 46 merit badges along the way (almost half of all those offered). He just loved scouting, and he learned a lot, including how to set goals for himself. His first goal was to become a Marine, which he did.

Having earned eagle scout status also helped him as a Marine in Viet Nam. Wynne told us that when he was a corporal his master sergeant assigned him to do some reconnaissance near camp, rather than some lower sergeants as would be the norm, because as an eagle scout "he knew how to use a compass". The sergeant had

seen it in his file. While they were out and only a mile from camp, it was hit by the enemy. They were told to stay away until they were radioed the "all clear". Two days later they were able to return, totally unscathed.

Wynne also shared some of the history of BSA with us, from its founding in England by Lord Baden Powell in 1907 and subsequent import to the U.S. in 1910, to its growth to a high of 5.5 million boys. Currently at 3.7 million, the percentage of eagle scouts has risen from just about 1% to almost 3%, proving how valuable those boys who stay in the program find that challenge. (It looks great on a résumé, too.) Well-known eagle scouts include President Ford, Steven Spielberg and Ozzie Nelson, and 90% of the cadets in military academies are eagles.

BSA used to be headquartered in New Jersey, but moved to Texas when Ross Perot headed the organization – he didn't like New Jersey and wanted it in his home state, so he offered them a free building if they would move. They did, selling the original building and using the funds for an endowment of which only the interest gets spent. The new facilities in Texas include the BSA collection of Norman Rockwell paintings.

The Jamboree site, which had been in Virginia for 25 years, was moved to West Virginia thanks to a \$25 million donation, allowing them to buy 20,000 acres of steeply rolling hills that had belonged to a local BSA council. The location was so isolated it needed roads, and buildings as basic as rest rooms. It was so steep a Bechtel engineer recommended a bridge be built across one of the dales rather than a very windy road. \$5.5 million later, the bridge is ready for this first year in the new location.

While the Boy Scouts is an international organization, it is handled differently in each country. The U.S. and Japan, for example, are the only two to require the boys wear their uniforms at all meetings. Though the spiffiest group in uniform Wynne said he's ever seen were a group of 17 - 20 year-olds from Alsace Lorraine, visiting Ste. Michelle. In Indonesia, which has the second largest number of troops, all boys enrolled in school must also join the Scouts.
