

Track Meet

Don Reinken reported the T-shirts have been ordered, the officials are scheduled and the letters went out to 73 high schools telling them about the event and how to register online. There was a committee meeting to work out details of how we can put PolioPlus information at the event and raise funds, as well as some other logistic details. Both Don and Ken Worthen gave some of the history of both polio and PolioPlus, the first such health project ever put in place by any service organization. Ken also talked about this new drive to eliminate polio and why – if we don't wipe it out from the three remaining countries where it is endemic, and stop vaccinating, we could see

as many as 40,000 new cases by 2040. Most of the 700 cases last year were in just two of those countries: Nigeria and Afghanistan. So far we have put over \$1.2 billion into this effort, and we are *this close*. There will be three posters or tri-fold boards to show the kids and their parents what PolioPlus is all about, and how to contribute.

Don passed out a sign-up sheet to volunteer for the various events or wherever help is needed. While some of the jobs start at 7:30, the track events are expected to start at 9:00. Fundraiser

PDG Les announced the June 1 fundraiser will be held at the Labor Local Hall on Devonshire, and it will be Mexican themed, from food to music and decorations. He's researching if there is a way supporters can write a check to the club foundation for the event or the tickets. In addition to the reverse raffle and entertainment, the event will also have a silent auction and possibly a "Chinese" auction (so named because of the restaurant take-out boxes used to hold the tickets). Cost will be just \$15/person. The next planning meeting will be Thursday, March 28, at 6:30 in Les's office.

Les also let us know the new Elephant Bar would open in Northridge March 9, and reservations are a must.

Constitution

In honor of the anniversary of the Bill of Rights, Jim gave out a few copies of the Constitution and offered to make a donation if anyone could tell him which of the original 12 amendments were not included in the 10 that passed. Turned out none of us knew, but one dealt with apportionment of representatives and the other, which actually passed very recently, prevented a sitting congress from receiving the salary increases they had voted on. That restriction had been in place for presidents, but not congress, until the 27th amendment, first submitted in 1789, was finally adopted in 1992 after being passed by enough states.

Speaker - Dave Friedman, Real Estate Today

One of our newest members, Dave comes to us with extensive and varied real estate background, having worked for many years as the facilities (real estate) buyer and seller for his family's packaging business on the west coast. He turned out not only to have a knack for it, but a growing passion. Moving into the residential market was an interesting challenge, especially since southern California, and Los Angeles in particular, seem to be very different than most other places.

For most people their house is their biggest asset, which raises the stakes when buying or selling. But in LA today the stakes also become more emotional because it's a sellers market, and buyers are facing lots of competition for good properties, forcing them, and their realtors, to get creative. Dave gave us examples of taking photos of the house and creating a profile of the buyers to get the seller to accept their bid without getting into bidding wars with others or multiple offers on their part. He keeps close tabs on everything to make it go smoothly.

Dave told us current values are down 40% from their last peak, with cycles usually 5-6 years in length. That means prices will be going higher. Currently the inventory of homes for sale is down 37% compared to last year, and prices are up 10% (equal to April of 2012, according to the chart Dave gave us). This turn around started happening last March, just after he wrote an article about it. And three weeks before the Daily News reported the same observations – Dave teased he should ask for credit.

Currently about 60% of sales are "regular" versus REO sales (foreclosures and short sales, which are foreclosures where the bank has agreed to accept less than the remaining loan amount). This turn around is bringing people back to the housing market, including those who lost homes due to foreclosure (as noted in the LA Times after this talk). In the under \$300,000 market, 40% are investors and half are cash buyers, with some of both in the higher price ranges.

In response to a question, Dave said condos and town homes get an undeserved bad rap. Yes, those in low to middle income areas went down 50%, but they ran up that much in 2007. They're more volatile, but better from a cash flow and investment perspective.
