June 1 Fundraiser

PDG Les passed out the forms to sign up raffle ticket buyers, including a yellow one for their receipt. Actual tickets will not be given out until the person's payment is received by Pete, the event treasurer. Although only one name will be used on each \$100 ticket, the owner is free to sell "shares" in it if they wish. Dinner payments can be made at the same time, but if we are able to have the raffle ticket payment be a donation, the dinner portion would be noted as not tax-deductible. Les will email us the sign-up form after checking on whether or not the ticket price can be tax deductible and made out to our club foundation, but we can start selling now! Prizes include the \$10,000 first prize, a \$500 second, and a large screen TV third. In addition to the reverse raffle, entertainment and buffet, the event will also have a silent auction and a "Chinese" auction. Please note the event is open only to friends, family and other Rotarians, not the general public, for legal reasons.

Club Assembly

Rich started off our assembly by thanking the club presidents, Jim and Martha, and everyone else for working to move our merger forward. Our focus now is to make the club work better, and that will be his focus as president next year. He passed out lists of the board and non-board positions with some volunteers names, and asked each of us to consider taking at least one position either as a committee chair, board member or committee member. He observed that we do have a structure within Rotary that sometimes we follow and sometimes ignore, but it does help us function when we use it.

Rich talked about the **Greater Van Nuys Rotary Club Survey** he sent out to those with email and its results. Of those with email, about half responded to the first set of questions and possibly a third to the second (just three questions). Each had agree (A), neutral (N) and disagree (D) options. Here are the results:

- 1. We should continue to invite qualified new members, especially women and younger persons. A 96%, N 4% (1 person), D 0%
- We should continue to keep our meeting agenda 1 hour (12:15 - 1:15) With fellowship and committee. discussions encouraged before and afterwards. A 83%, N 13%, D 4%
- We should acknowledge the flag of our country with a flag salute. We should have a short 30 second moment of silence and have a Rotary Minute in lieu of the flag salute and invocation. (This was probably supposed to e two different items.) A 43%, N 17%, D 39%
- 4. We should continue passing the Polio Plus Pig for voluntary drawings and make quarterly donations in a winning members name. A 58%, N 33%, D 8%
- We should have meeting programs that align with RI monthly themes, i.e. Youth, Foundation, Literacy, etc. coördinated by the respective committee chair. A 58%, N 29%, D 13%
- 6. We should have monthly "craft talks" by members. A 63%, N 29%, D 8%
- 7. We should get as many members as possible in committee and program positions. A 92%, N 8%, D $_{0\%}$
- In order to accommodate as many members/guests as possible we should have a demotion party on a Thursday evening at the 94th(\$32.00 per plate) to cover all costs. A 50%, N 29%, D 21%
- 9. We should have regular "twilight" meetings (5:30 p.m.) once a month. A 25%, N 50%, D 25%
- 10. We should combine the 50/50 raffle and "Happy Bucks" (i.e., buy more tickets) to make pots bigger and help with meeting expenses. A 54%, N 25%, D 21%
- 11. We should simplify lunch payments by having all attendees pay at the door. A 28%, N 33%, D 39%
- 12. We should simplify lunch payments by having all members prepay for lunches with their regular monthly bill. A 28%, N 11%, D 61%
- We should leave the lunch payment options as they are now. (Note: rate may be adjusted due to costs.) A 33%, N 22%, D 44% (all fractions less than .5)

Rich noted there was little everyone agreed on, other than bringing in more young and female members, with almost everyone agreeing we should keep meetings to one hour. Asked how some of the items would be decided, he explained these were beginning discussion points, though he would take the president's prerogative of managing the meeting agenda, possibly moving the speaker to the first item since some folks complain the announcements are boring.

In discussion, Beth asked about the intent of question 10, noting that would mean monies intended to go into the club treasury (Happy Bucks) would be cut in half, so instead of increasing the club funds doing this might actually reduce them. The thought was to increase ticket sales. Beth and others suggested we use a different price structure for tickets, so that \$1 would buy one, perhaps \$2 buy 3, etc., to draw in people who are reluctant to spend \$5 for one ticket. Judy explained that \$5 used to buy 10 tickets, but everyone bought 10 so they went to just one.

But with our combined group over half the people are new to this raffle, so she agreed perhaps we should change it.

PDG Emilio reminded us the meal charge from the restaurant has gone up (as of January 1), and our \$20 no longer covers it. He wasn't sure what the restaurant is charging in total, but we need to stop using club funds to cover the difference – our by-laws prohibit it. By the next board meeting we need to have a solution. In discussion, the \$10/month fee for guest and speaker meals does seem to be covering those. If we just do a pass-through of the restaurant charge, that will require the person collecting it to have change, so we should decide on a flat dollar amount.

PDG Emilio also noted that we are a 55 member club, but see the same 25 or so faces every week – please contact your missing friends and get them to attend more regularly so we get more complete club participation. The other aspect of membership is attracting new people. Why are we not getting more young members? We need to more aggressively use social media, and most of us are very reluctant. If we will send him write-ups of projects and event, such as the track meet, eye clinic, bingo and raffle, he'll make sure they are put on our website and FB. We need to make a concerted effort to stay active on these sites.

Leadership Awards 6th – 8th Grades

Both the junior high student leadership awards and mini-grants to middle school teachers were presented March 21. Students were recognized for excellence in several areas. Citlali Castillo at Madison Middle School won the prize for excellence in academics; co-winners Brian Piche at Avlley Alternative Magnet and Nancy Alanis at Vista Middle School split the prize for athletics; the arts award went to Justine Yap at Vista, and the Community Service/Leadership award was split between Nayellie Barragan-Mejia at Madison and Inkiad Ahmed at Frost.
