

SPEAKER: Nora MacLellan, Vision to Learn

An active member of the Westchester Rotary club, one of Nora MacLellan's many jobs is being the volunteer director of Vision To Learn, a 501(c) (3) not-for-profit public charity created by the Beutner Family Foundation. They provide free eye exams glasses to elementary

school students in low-income communities throughout California. The glasses help kids do better in school, which provides them with a foundation for a better life. As Nora laid out in her PowerPoint presentation:

- 80% of all learning during the first 12 years of a child's life is dependent on vision.
- 60% of "problem learners" have undetected vision problems.
- 90% of children's vision problems are correctable with eyeglasses.
- 50,000 to 60,000 K-5 students in Los Angeles need glasses to see the chalkboard or read a book.

With now two mobile clinics, staffed by professional optometrists and volunteers, Vision to Learn spends up to an entire day at a school, and visits schools five days a week. Before that visit, students receive basic vision screening from the school nurse or volunteers, the school gets signed consent forms from parents allowing VTL to treat the children, and those who need extra testing are referred to VTL. After their exam by VTL clinicians, the students select and get fitted for frames. Their prescription glasses are then dispensed at the school two weeks later.

The whole program is just over a year old, being launched March 27, 2012 at Langdon Elementary School, a campus of LAUSD. The Archdiocese of Los Angeles school program launched May 15 of last year, at St. Malachy Elementary School. But just because they're focused on schools doesn't mean they get the summer off. Last year's summer calendar included LAUSD's "Beyond the Bell" program and "A Place Called Home". They're also developing programs with Boys and Girls Clubs and the YMCA, with a full calendar of LAUSD and parochial schools scheduled through June 2013.

To date Vision To Learn has examined 8,502 kids and provided 6,471 glasses.

This program has proven so successful and is so important, the District has made it an official project. Among other goals is to provide a new vehicle, which will have our District 5280 logo. There are plans to train more volunteers to help screen children and provide basic help on-site, enter data, offer translation assistance, update the website and sponsor schools. In addition to all that, funds

are needed – it costs just \$20 to provide a pair of glasses, but with eye exams and transportation, the cost per child is actually \$100. (Having just gone to my optometrist today, that's quite a bargain – less than my insurance copay for one pair of glasses reusing old frames!)

Other groups besides Rotary are helping. A 5th grade Girl Scout troop is selling lemonade and cookies this Memorial Day to raise funds, and they expect to generate \$4,000. Students at a local high school donated a percentage of every ticket sold to their winter dance to the group, and other charities, like the Y, are giving support. If you or a school you know would like to do an event, VTL will bring their mobile clinic, board members and glasses for a donation at a given level.
