

#### **Avionics Tour**



**SPEAKER**: Nathallie Trejo, New Economics for Women Mauricio introduced all of our guests from New Economics for Women (NEW), noting that next year we'll be working with them and Dr. Barry Leonard on an eye clinic for the community to be held in the NEW facility.

Nathallie gave us a good overview of the many ways NEW helps families in the Valley, from a Smart Consumer class, held in English November 17 and in Spanish for two days in December, to tutoring to parenting classes. They also teach anti-gang and drugs seminars to different age groups (including parents), and sex education for parents to discuss with their children, as well as one for teenagers.

Tutoring help focuses on K-5 grades. NEW provides computer labs and lots of help, but not just to kids. They hold 3-hour classes every Monday on computer basics. One of NEW's main objectives is to be a single-stop resource, offering legal services, workshops, tutoring, job direction and financial counseling, or referrals to those places and groups that have them, or whatever else families need. Especially anything that can help support kids and schools.


