

Destry proceeded to tell us more about himself. He is a member of the NH Toastmasters group, belongs to a bowling league at Corbin Bowl, where he was thrilled to get a watch commemorating his first 200 game. Destry also really enjoyed the golf tournaments the Mid SFV club used to put on every year for NH clients. He's been working for Global Messenger since 2006, participating in the Special Olympics since 2000, and is a member of the Self Advocacy Board of Los Angeles County, a group that focuses on supporting people with developmental disabilities on how to exercise their rights, influence legislation and interact with local leaders to help them understand the viewpoints of people with developmental disabilities.

Mauricio presented Destry with a special certificate of recognition and a gift certificate, in honor of all he has achieved. Destry asked to be called if anyone would like to donate to or help the Special Olympics. He can be reached at 818-342-0017. The organization's website is www.sosc.org.

Holly then introduced Connie Matthews of Providence Tarzana Hospital. Connie is a volunteer who got "hooked" when she was given a tour of NH. She was awed by both the clients and the amazing things being accomplished with them. She hired a NH client and became a volunteer, currently doing community outreach while working on the NH Diamond Project, for their 60th anniversary.

Connie showed us a video about NH which quickly covered everything from their many group homes, housing 6 clients each along with staff, to their 220 client/employee workshop, which handles more than \$2 million in goods and services for over 100 local, national and international businesses every year. Clients learn about workplace environments and expectations, are taught interviewing skills and helped to get jobs. Parents and guardians are grateful for all that NH does, but the clients are even more so – they blossom, often feeling worthwhile and "normal" for the first time.

Holly suggested that if any of us have work that needs to be done, in our office or outside, that we consider hiring NH clients. In their workshop they do assembly of many things, including mailers. "When you hire one of our workers, New Horizons will also provide an experienced

job coach at no cost. This professional coach will work at the job site alongside your new employee and provide whatever training and assistance he or she might need in order to learn the job and perform up to your standards of quality." 
