Meet Jevon Powell

So, he left New York City and moved to the Bay Area to learn consulting. After four years and countless air miles, he realized his checkbook was full, but his datebook was empty. He switched gears again, moved to Seattle in 2001 to launch his consulting practice, and soon met his wife. They have active and fun 10-year old twin boys.

When he came to Seattle, he joined a boutique consulting firm, then became a partner, and now owns the company. You see the trend?

As a consulting psychologist, Jevon sees his mission as helping leaders engage employees. He does this through executive coaching, team building, and change

management. His ideal client is a small or mid-size organization that wants to develop stronger leaders.
