

# **NEW MEMBER CHECKLIST**

### ATTEND THE WEEKLY LUNCHEON

There are many ways to get involved with Seattle 4 Rotary beginning with regular attendance. While the club no longer has a required minimum attendance level, regular attendance habits allow better participation and commitment, and enable the club to generate the best possible programs – local, national, and internationally-known speakers.

## STAY UP TO DATE

The club bulletin, the **Totem**, is emailed each Friday, indicating our upcoming meeting location and speaker, details on committee and club events, and other club highlights. Reading the **Totem** is one of the key ways to stay up to date on activities and other important information about your club.

## ATTEND A SEATTLE ROTARY AFTER HOURS EVENT

Seattle 4 Rotary holds a monthly *After Hours* at the Rainier Club. The objective of these events is to give members, especially our newest members, the opportunity to connect in a more casual and one-on-one environment than our weekly luncheon. These events typically include a short presentation highlighting a featured club member or committee, plus plenty of time for socializing. # □ PARTICIPATE IN A COMMUNITY SERVICE ACTIVITY

Seattle 4 Rotary's service committees work actively to plan a variety of service opportunities for club members throughout the year. Keep an eye on the **Totem** newsletter for information upcoming events.

To get started, volunteer at one of the following opportunities that happen every month:

#### **Harvest Against Hunger Work Party**

Second Saturday of the month, 8:30 am at the Northwest Harvest warehouse in Kent

Rotarians from across the district gather to sort large donations of fresh produce direct from our region's farms and distributors into family-sized portions to be given out at local food banks. This event is open to all Rotarians, friends, and family, including children ages eight and above.

#### **Wellspring Family Services Work Party**

Fourth Saturday of the month, 9:15 am at Wellspring Family Services on Rainier Avenue South

Spend a Saturday morning with your fellow Rotarians helping homeless families at Wellspring Family Services. Volunteers sort donations for Wellspring's Baby Boutique, a free clothing store for children facing homelessness. This event is open to all Rotarians, friends, and family, including children.

## ATTEND A FELLOWSHIP OR NETWORKING NIGHT

Opportunities abound! In addition to the *After Hours* events there are "extras" like Rotary Mariners outings, ethnic dinners, sporting and arts events, networking nights, and vocational tours. These are offered at various times throughout the year and can be your ticket to an enjoyable and rewarding Rotary experience.

### ENGAGE WITH THE WIDER WORLD OF ROTARY
