## Swimarathon February 25, 2012

Twenty-seven members and friends of the Rotary Clubs of Vancouver, Greater Clark County and Woodland gathered at Lake Shore Athletic Club at 4 a.m. on February 25 to swim in the Rotary Global Swimarathon. Participants swam laps worldwide at the exact same time (Between noon and 1 p.m., GMT) to raise funds for Rotary's PolioPlus program, which works to eradicate polio, and to be listed in the Guinness

Book of Records for the most swimmers swimming 100 meters in a given hour. The previous World Record was 2,533. The Rotary Global Swimarathon broke the record with

more than 5,000 participants. Greg Jellison, Bill Byrd III and Gary Bock set the local pace by swimming 47, 42 and 31 laps respectively to raise funds for PolioPlus.

As you know, the Rotary Club Vancouver, District 5100 and Rotary International supported the Rotary Club Puerto Vallarta Sur in its clean water project. Five water filtration systems were purchased and installed and we are proud to say that the project was a great success. Early signs show that the health of children and villagers improved as well as their quality of life.

Spring-boarding off the success of our clean water International Service projects in Rural Mexico in continuing partnership with the South Puerto Vallarta (PV) Mexico Rotary Club, we have officially submitted our next International service project grant to District and to Rotary International!

This project is an educational scholarship program that if we receive 100% of the expected matching grants, is intended to keep 110 Kids from underprivileged families in school for one additional year (instead of families needing to remove them from

couver Rotary Foundation Grant of \$3,500 combined with the PV club contribution and then leveraging these funds with District and Rotary International Foundation matching grants.

When I spoke to Vic to prepare for this article, it was immediately clear that his knowledge about Rotary and our Club was unprecedented.

#### The Facts:

Vic joined the Club on November 14, 1960.

At the time, the Club had 110 members and dues were \$30. At 91 years of age (soon to be 92), Vic is the oldest member of our Club and has been Club Secretary since 1987. He is happy in that role and, like a good bridesmaid, preferred that job to over becoming Club President. Before he took up the job of Club Secretary, Vic served on the Board for five years and became a PHF in 1990.
