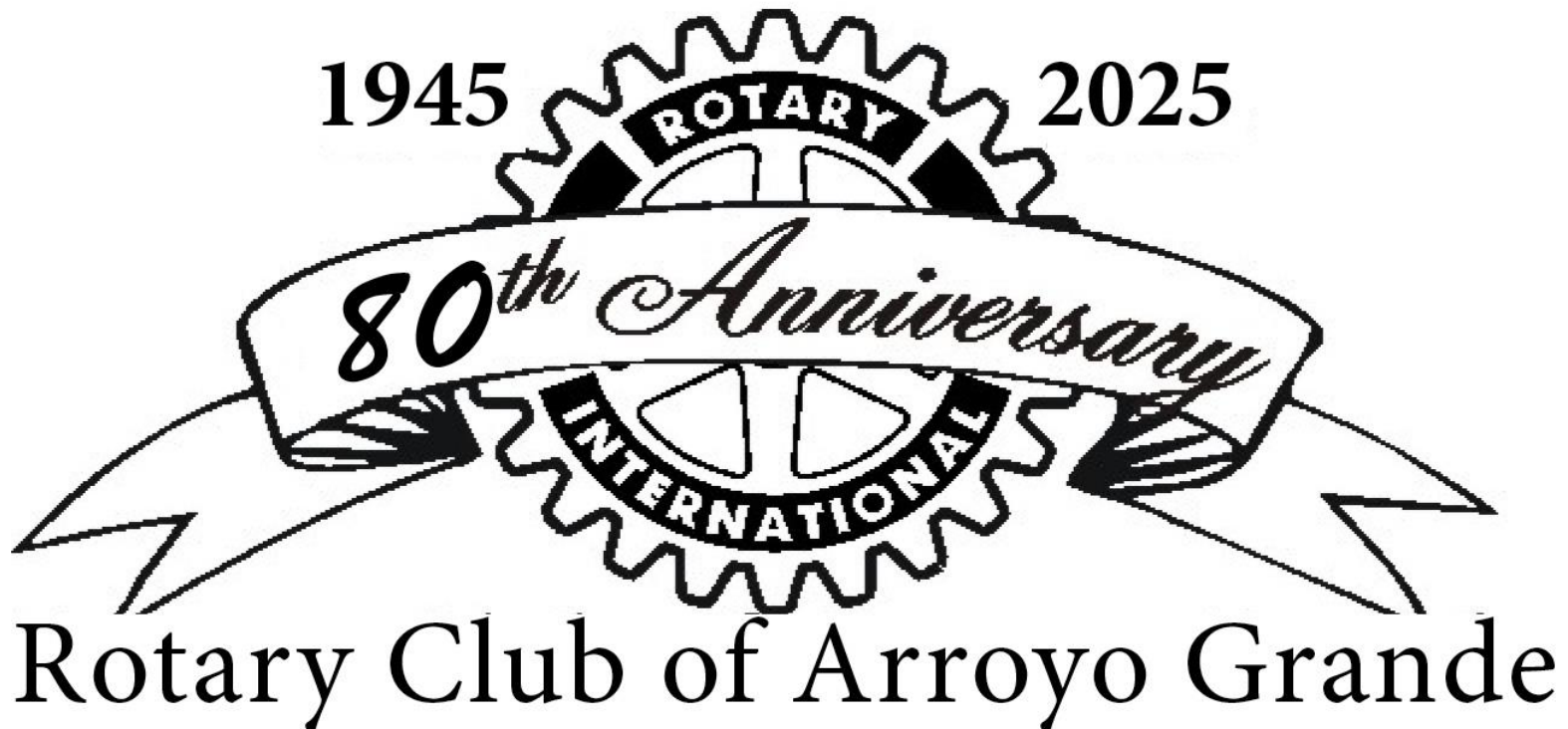

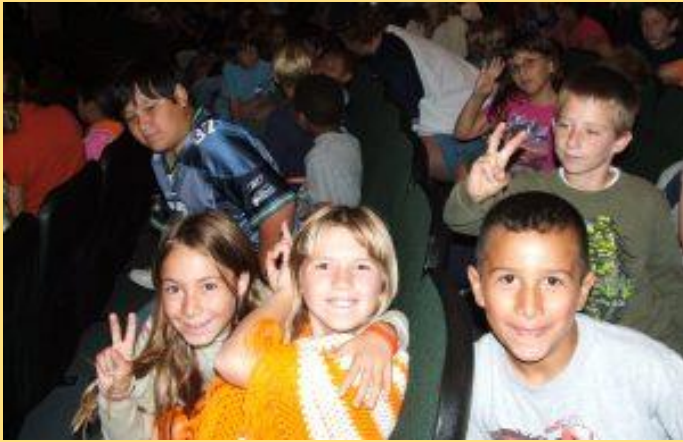

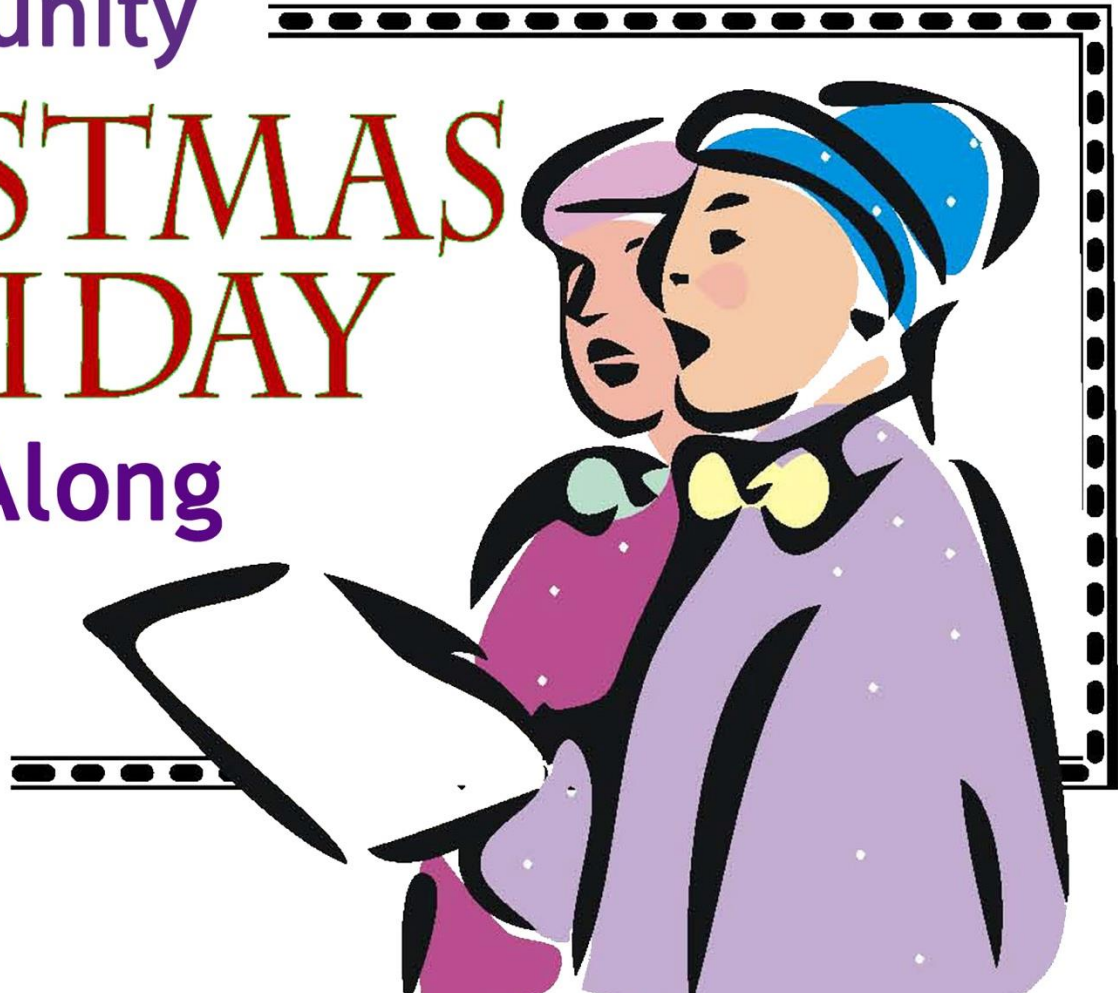

# Yearly Scholarships since 1965

- Student scholarships started in 1965 with money raised from the Fish Fry.
- 1999 raised to \$10,000 each year to a Arroyo Grande High School student.  
Total of \$245,000
- \$2000 a year to Lopez High School students. Total of \$35,000
- Rotary Youth Leadership Assemblies (RYLA)
