For all students working toward a four year college degree, studying in a CTE or trade school program, or attending Cuesta College.

How To Apply for a Rotary Scholarship The applicant must:

- Submit the applicable Scholarship application to the high school you attend (AHS; Paloma Creek; ACE). AND ...
- Submit a brief essay to the Rotary Club of Atascadero
 - Essay MUST be emailed to: atascaderorotaryfoundation@gmail.com
 - Essay must be in WORD or PDF format. NO GOOGLE DOCS.
 - Essay must include your name, school, and email address in top right hand corner.

The essay must include the following:

- Who you are
- What have you done (school activities, community service, job experience, academic achievement)
- What will you do (higher education goals, career goals, community service interests)
- What makes you unique and the best fit to receive this scholarship (tell us why you should get a scholarship)

By submitting your application you are giving permission to your school to release your student transcript to be reviewed as part of the application process. Your transcript will only be viewed by the selection committee. It will then be returned to your school

Application and Essay Due: March 1, 2023

Qualifications/Criteria

- There is NO minimum GPA requirement. All students are encouraged to apply.
- Applicants will be evaluated on GPA, community involvement, extracurricular activities, and need.
- Top applicants will be interviewed by representatives of the Scholarship Committee.

Scholarships are available to students interested in a vocational career, or Career Technical Education (CTE). These careers may be in nursing, automotive technician, paramedics, dentistry, physical therapy, construction, and other such careers.

Rotary International is a worldwide organization of business and professional men and women united to provide humanitarian service, encourage high ethical standards in all vocations, and help build goodwill and peace in the world. The Rotary Club of Atascadero has established 12 scholarships (see table below).
