

Becky DeCarlo—The Forgotten Initiative

Becky and her husband Dominic have been married for 20 years. In the early years of their marriage the Lord laid foster care and adoption on their hearts. However, it would be 14 years before it would become part of their lives. In the meantime, they had three biological daughters (now 16, 14, and 8) and life felt full. They busied themselves with family, church and homeschooling. In the summer of 2010 a desire to delve into the world of foster care and adoption was once again laid on their hearts. They were quickly licensed and within a few days had a call for their first placement. A baby boy and his sister were placed in their home and they began the amazing ministry of not only loving these children, but also mentoring their parents. It was then that they realized that their journey in foster care was much more than they had originally expected. Though this placement did not end in adoption like they had hoped, Dominic and Becky's eyes were opened to the many needs of the foster care community. In the fall of 2011, with a new little one in their home, the son they had been praying for - Becky began to feel a sense of urgency to bring awareness to the forgotten in foster care. It was then that she happened upon a blog of a fellow adoptive mom and the founder of a ministry called The Forgotten Initiative. She knew immediately that this is what Bakersfield needed and soon became the local advocate. Since then she has had the honor of sharing with churches, small groups, service groups and anybody who will listen about the many needs in the foster care community. She has watched as people have given generously of their time, their resources and their talents to bring the love of Jesus to those who feel forgotten. Countless hours have been spent advocating, sharing, praying and working to connect the body of Christ with the needs of foster children, social workers, and birth parents. Becky loves to talk about foster care and adoption and loves to be a part of bringing awareness to the forgotten in her community. The Forgotten Initiative (TFI) has been working closely with the Department of Human Services for nearly 4 years and our influence and donations have continued to grow. Becky is excited to see how the Lord will use her and TFI in the new year and she is humbled by the way the Lord has allowed her to be a voice for those in the foster care community.

The Mission of the Forgotten Initiative is to bring joy and purpose to the foster car community. One way they do that is by making journey bags. These are bags filled with personal item as, such as clothes, underwear, socks, blankets and personal items that each child received when they are taken from their homes. These bags help the foster parents, as sometime they are placed in the middle of the night with nothing but the clothes on their backs. More importantly, these bags are a source of comfort for each child.
