# The Stat of Oil & Energy In Kern County

Jenifer Pitcher was born and raised in Bakersfield. She attended Centennial High School, then went to California Lutheran University, then CSUB where she completed her Bachelors and Masters Degrees. The past 7 years she has worked in government and public relations, including work in Congress and California Senate. She is currently the Senior Coordinator for valley production for the Western States Petroleum Association, WSPA.

When oil production was at a high back in 2013 the petroleum industry provided over 1/2 million jobs in California, contributed \$113 billion (5%) to the states GDP and \$21 million in state tax revenue. Here in Kern County, the industry employs over 50,000 people and the county get 1/3 of it's property taxes from oil and California gets about \$400 million. California is the third largest energy producer in the US, and Kern County produces 75 to 80%.

Recent declines in oil prices have caused Kern County to declare a state of emergency, with a \$60 million reduction in the county budget. California is pushing towards more green energy, (wind & solar), and wants to increase regulations, but petroleum use is not going away soon. 96% of transportation is still oil based. California uses 42 million gallons of gas a day. We are the third largest energy user in the world, China being number 1 and the rest of the US number 2.

We have been safely fracking here in Kern for over 60 years, with no ground water contamination or any systemic activity. A statewide environment report reviewed 2 million square miles and took over 3 years was approved by Kern County in 2015, but has not been approved by the state. California is already the most regulated state in the world. State Bill 350 called for the oil production to be cut in half by the year 2030, it was defeated, but we can expect more regulations to come. Many countries have no regulations at all, which is a global problem.

The decline in oil production here in Kern County has made it harder to get permits for drilling and fracking and we don't know when things will turn around.
