Desiree Von Flue works for the Kern County Superintendent of Schools. Catherine Jackson is a 6th grade teacher working on her 31st year as a teacher. Both women are involved and have a passion for Camp KEEP. There are 2 Camp facilities, one in Cambria and one in Los Osos. The program was started in the 1970's and is designed around science standards and our Eco-system. It is a 5 day camp for 6th graders. The cost to attend is \$245 plus transportation costs, what money that isn't generated by



the schools is funded through scholarships. They have a fund raising goal of \$40,000 per year, and this years fundraiser, Wine for Camp KEEP is Saturday May 14th from 6-9pm. Tickets are \$40 each and can be purchased by calling 661-636-4629.

Catherine shared the children's stories about Camp KEEP, including her own daughter who didn't want to go and came back a different person. She even served as a counselor 10 times. Then there was a boy named William, who was very large and didn't want to go because he didn't think he would be able to climb 2 1/2 miles up Valencia Peak. He went and came back with a whole new attitude, telling her that "I can do anything I want to do if I try hard enough". Finally there was Malik; his family could not afford for him to go, plus they couldn't afford a sleeping bag, tennis shoes and the proper clothing needed. Catherine asked if she could get everything he needed, would they let him come. He ended up making the trip and experienced seeing the ocean for the first time. These kids have a great time, make new friends, build confidence and see the world differently when they return home.
