Update: Polio as of August 2, 2017

Headlines: Pakistan and Afghanistan programs continue coordination at the national and sub-national levels, with special focus on improving the quality of program implementation (supplementary immunization activities and surveillance) in the southern corridor (Quetta Block-Greater Kandahar) with ongoing WPV1 transmission.

Afghanistan: NO new wild poliovirus type 1 cases were reported in the past week. The total number of cases in the country this year, 2017 remains at 5.

Pakistan: NO new wild poliovirus type 1 were reported in the past week. The total number of cases for 2017 remains at 3.

Nigeria: NO new wild poliovirus type 1 were reported in the past week. In fact, there have been no cases of polio in Nigeria in 2017. Total number of cases in 2016 were 4.

A problem remains with (cVDPV2), 4 cases of polio from the type 2 vaccine in the Democratic Republic of the Congo. Syrian Arab Republic had no more cases, the number now still stands at for this year 2017.

Syria: NO new cases of circulating vaccine-derived poliovirus type 2 have been officially confirmed at WHO headquarters in the past week, however 3 cases have been reported at the regional level, and will be reflected at the global level in next week's data.

Remember: October 24th is World Polio Day - The Countdown to History starts after the final Polio case.

Our 2017 Polio Plus Fundraising Goal is \$50 Million-which the Gates Foundation will match \$100 Million to our \$50 Million per year.
